Description how the Lead Mitigation Program work

- To start the process fill out and application: An application can be submitted via mail, email, phone, or online at www.mtyhd.org/LLMP
- 2. **Evaluation of Eligibility:** If your home is eligible, we will inform you in writing and we will schedule a lead hazard Evaluation on site.
- 3. Lead hazard Evaluation on site: A lead-based paint inspection will be conducted by a certified Lead Assessor Inspector. The result of the inspection will indicate if Lead-based paint is present in the house.
- 4. Licensed Lead Contractor will be assigned to your project:

 The duration of the work and repairs depend on the size
 and amount of lead found on the structure. The work done
 by certified contractors is at no cost to you.
- 5. **Begin on site work:** Repairs, removal and remediation of components will be done.
- 6. A Final Clearance Inspection will be conducted: To confirm repairs have been completed according to standards.

7. Result of the clearance:

- 7.a) A passed clearance indicates your project is completed and is in compliance with standards.
- 7.b) A clearance failure indicates that a corrective action needs to be done by the contractor.
