Dear Medical Directors, Nursing Leaders, Pharmacy Leaders, Right Care Enthusiasts, and Clinical Quality Improvement Leaders:

On Tuesday, September 28, we will have the pleasure of hearing from seven leading women physicians and scientists, starting off with Noel Bairey Merz, MD from the Barbra Streisand Women's Heart Center. She will present an overview of the Right Care Initiative's Women's CVD Writing Group and the importance of raising awareness on young women's early mortality threats. Then, Jessica Núñez de Ybarra, MD, MPH, FACPM, from the California Department of Public Health will share the State Action Plan for heart attack and stroke prevention. To finish the first hour, Nisha Parikh, MD, MPH, from UCSF will discuss the issues of pre-eclampsia and pregnancy-related CVD.

In our second hour, we will have a panel of four physician-scientist mothers who will share not only their medical recommendations from a career perspective, but also their own patient stories as mothers. The four speakers

are: Catrina Taylor, PhD, a CDPH Epidemiologist, Sara Johnson, MD, an Alta Bates Summit Medical Center Gynecologist, Nirali Vora, MD, a Stanford Stroke Neurologist, and Eveline Stock, MD, a UCSF Molecular Cardiologist.

About the University of Best Practices (UBP)

The Right Care University of Best Practices is a 14 year collaborative public-private effort to reduce preventable disability and death from heart attacks, strokes, heart failure, and diabetes. In 2020, we added programming on Severe Acute Respiratory Virus-2.

We focus on important preventive measures such as the control of blood pressure, lipids, and blood sugar to avoid preventable morbidity and mortality. This quality improvement effort, operated by the UC Berkeley School of Public Health, was publicly launched with the Department of Managed Health Care, NCQA and the Deans of UC Berkeley and UCLA Schools of Public Health in 2007, after initial planning in 2006, to improve patient outcomes for all patients in all delivery systems, from large integrated health systems to medical groups, health plans, community clinics, the V.A., military medicine, minute clinics, pharmacies, etc.

The University of Best Practices provides an opportunity for medical, pharmacy and health care quality leaders, along with public health officials, to collaborate around learning from both successful approaches (and those that were unsuccessful) to improve outcomes. Each meeting will feature speakers with knowledge and experience achieving benchmark outcomes, as well as opportunities for strategic discussion.
