i. VTC: General Updates • Kurt Schake	 VTC was awarded a \$12 million grant from the State of California HCD Veterans Housing and Homelessness prevention fund. Lightfighter Village is now complete in its
	financial phase. They expect to break ground by the end of the year or early next year on that project.

• VTC is also in the final phases of negotiations with the Federal Government on the Monterey Enhanced Use Lease. The plan is to build 40 or 80 units of affordable housing if that lease is
obtained.
