1:15-1:50	Topic: MCBH would like the CRHC to provide oversight to: Establish and implement a transparent and inclusive process for obtaining client/participant, community, and staff input related to cultural competence planning, implementation, monitoring and evaluation. - Need to identify: - What processes are currently in place to collect data? - What types of data and information are currently collected? - What are the viewpoints that are represented? i.e., client, youth, family member, community, staff etc. - How/when is available data reviewed? - How is data used to guide decisions? - Questions for CRHC: - What are ways to improve upon current practices? - What are additional ways to get client, community and staff input? And ways to hear from people who do not engage in care? - MCBH to host listening sessions the 2 nd Wednesday of the month from 1:00-1:30 with the Patient's Right Advocate & Ethnic Services Manager to provide community a consistent space to share concerns and to address issues that are impacting access to care.	Discussion: Pamela: noted need for inclusion amongst different community groups and that during the Community Program Planning Process with Michelle we identified resources in our community and assets and recommended we look at those. We need to know: what our resources are, who we are beyond color and get to know one another and understand one another, beginning with our ancestors. Also, suggested we look at the Guiding principles from SAMHSA. Kacy: Made recommendation to look internally at MCBH as we could do better job at communicating with MCBH staff about committee & the goals and objectives. Noted what happens around inclusivity is also about equity and shared concern that different groups could potentially be pitted against one for funding. Also noted limitations of data and that it tends not to be fully accurate or tell full picture. Especially If looking at data from a top down perspective or predominate cultural perspective. Yvette: Noted we should focus on finding things that are common and advocating together – try and move beyond competition – organize and get information to come up with common goals. Starts with talking to people and basic organizing. Jacob: noted that the way we (Epicenter) collect data through EvalCorp has been helpful and useful. Since we are still in shelter in place, the methods that we use to collect data are limited, especially when we are depending on
