**Subject:** N95 Mask Usage Mandatory in Hospitals

Effective immediately all EMS personnel entering a hospital are required to wear a properly fitted and applied N95 mask for the duration of their time inside the facility. This requirement applies to all EMS personnel regardless of their vaccine status or COVID positivity.

The EMS Agency is instituting this change in response to the significantly increased transmissibility of the Omicron variant of COVID-19, the greater occurrence of asymptomatic persons who are testing positive for COVID-19, and the most recent information on appropriate masking. Additionally, this requirement is aligned with hospital requirements for personnel who access clinical areas.

We understand that the immediate implementation of this requirement may create a supply challenge for some agencies.
