Jack Murphy reported	Panetta's, D.C.'s, Military Legislative Assistant to push the issue forward. He added that he met with Congresswoman Zoe Lofgren at an event she hosted to hear from the veteran community and she seemed to support establishing a pharmacy at the Gourley Clinic as well.

Rick Johnson, Del Rey Oaks	<ul> <li>Reported that he has added an article in Del Rey Oaks         Newsletter about VIAC and MVAO which has generated         communications between their veteran community and himself         as Del Rey Oak's representative. It was also noted by Jonathan         Brown from MVAO that the article has initiated referrals to his         office from veterans seeking to connect with their VA benefits.     </li> </ul>
Wesly Haye, Marina	Reported he would like to also have an article in Marina's newsletter, similar to Del Rey Oaks'.
Chair, Mayor Ian Oglesby, Seaside	Reported Seaside is looking into the MOU for the Northern Endowment Fund Parcel adjacent to CCCVC as well as the parcel on the same side of the street as the cemetery that was originally parceled off for an ancillary structure in regard to where both the MOU and the parcels stand today and how Seaside can continue to support the veteran community and CCCVC.

i. Cal-Vet Veterans Home Proposal  • Jason Cameron reported	<ul> <li>MVAO is working heavily with all the municipalities within Monterey County as well as neighboring counties' city councils to support the legislation to establish a ninth Veteran Home, here in Monterey County. He has already received letters of support from San Luis Obispo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, and San Mateo Counties.</li> <li>He recently spoke at a California Association of Veteran Service Officers (CACVSO) Legislative Committee Meeting at which time they voted unanimously to include the issue as a legislative priority this year.</li> <li>He has also given a presentation to San Benito's Board of Supervisors and will ask Mr. Bogan to deliver a request for support from the national veteran organizations that he will be meeting with next week on his trip to Washington D.C.</li> </ul>
ii. Monthly Report  • Jason Cameron Reported	<ul> <li>His office will be closely monitoring the reemergence of the contaminated water supply at Fort Ord while it was still functioning and the resulting illnesses that veterans are experiencing.</li> <li>MVAO was also asked to and provided a letter of support for AB 1623 and thanked Assemblymember Rivas' office for co-signing on to that bill as well.</li> <li>The County Budget Committee approved to increase the Stand Down funding by an additional \$50,000 which would take the funding to \$1000,000 if approved at the March 8<sup>th</sup> Board of Supervisors meeting.</li> <li>Please see both the annual and monthly MVAO report attached.</li> </ul>
