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SPECIMEN COLLECTION INSTRUCTIONS FOR MONKEYPOX VIRUS (MPXV) TESTING UPDATED 07/26/2022

Pre-approval is required for testing. Health care providers must contact the Monterey County Health Department's Communicable Disease Unit (831-755-4521) for consultation and testing approval.

Specimens may be delivered **Monday – Friday** between the hours of **8:00 a.m. and 4:30 p.m**. Inadequate or inappropriate specimen collection, storage and transport may yield false test results.

Please contact the Public Health Microbiologists at (831)755-4516 if you have any questions regarding specimen collection.

Please use appropriate PPE prior to collecting specimens.

Collection materials needed per lesion:

- 3 Sterile dry swabs (nylon, polyester, or Dacron with plastic or aluminum shafts) Note: cotton or calcium alginate swabs are unacceptable
- 3 Sterile containers <u>OR</u> 3 Viral Transport Media (VTM) Tubes
- 1 red biohazard bag
- 1 MCPHL requisition form

Instructions:

- 1. Collect at least 3 swabs from the same lesion (1 swab is for MCPHL testing validation).
- 2. If possible, unroof lesions with a sterile needle. Vigorously swab or brush lesion with the three sterile dry swabs.
- Place the swab into the dry sterile container <u>OR</u> VTM tube. Break the shaft of the swab just below the top of the container and secure the lid. <u>Individual swabs must be placed into separate sterile containers. Do not pool</u> <u>swabs into one container.</u>
- 4. Clearly mark paired specimens and label each container/VTM tube with the patient's name, date of birth, specimen source (site of lesion), and date of collection. Improperly labeled specimens will be rejected.

Note: Each swab must be clearly marked with which lesion it belongs to, e.g., "L elbow swab #1" and "L elbow swab #2".

- 5. More than one lesion should be sampled, preferably from different body sites.
- Swabs stored in viral transport media (VTM) are accepted, but not preferred. <u>DO NOT USE UNIVERSAL</u> <u>TRANSPORT MEDIA (UTM).</u>
- 7. Lesion crusts or scabs may be submitted <u>dry</u> in separate sterile containers that are clearly labeled.
- Place the container <u>inside</u> the biohazard plastic bag. Place the laboratory requisition in the sleeve <u>outside</u> of the bag.
- 9. Store the specimen refrigerated, 2-8°C, if transporting to the laboratory within 24-72 hours. If transport time will be greater than 72 hours, store at -20°C to -80°C. Specimens not meeting these criteria may be rejected.

Note: The above instructions are for MPXV testing performed at Santa Clara Public Health Laboratory with confirmation testing at CDC. MCPHL is in process of implementing MPXV testing in-house. Specimen collection instructions for testing at MCPHL will be forthcoming.
