### ST Elevation Myocardial Infarction (STEMI) Quality Improvement Committee:

The STEMI QI Committee has not met since the last report we provided to this group. Currently, the EMS Agency is working on the annual update for the STEMI QI Plan. This plan will be a part of the EMS Agency's Annual Plan to the EMS Authority. More to come after the next STEMI QI meeting.

### **Stroke Quality Improvement Committee:**

The Stroke QI Committee has not met since the last report we provided to this group. Currently, the EMS Agency is working on the annual update for the Stroke QI Plan. This plan will be a part of the EMS Agency's Annual Plan to the EMS Authority. More to come after the next Stroke QI meeting.

### **Trauma Evaluation and Quality Improvement Committee (TEQIC):**

The TEQIC has not met since the last report we provided to this group. The Verification Review Committee of the American College of Surgeons (ACS) notified Natividad that they have received official verification as a Level II trauma center through November 7, 2025. Verification by the ACS confirms that a trauma center has demonstrated its commitment to providing the highest quality trauma care for all injured patients. We congratulate Natividad on this significant accomplishment! With the upcoming end of the state of emergency related to COVID-19 and the EMS Authority's resulting return to the standard requirements for annual plan submission by local EMS agencies, we are working on completing a trauma system status report as a part of our annual EMS Plan update. We also continue to review data related to the treatment of patients with cardiac arrest potentially caused by trauma.

#### **CQI TAG:**

The CQI TAG met on December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2022. During the meeting, there was no new business addressed. However, several updates for ongoing topics were presented. Public comments were presented to the group from the 2023 Policy and Review Cycle, as were the EMS Agency's responses. In reference to the High-Performance CPR Initiative, both Blake and Dr. Beuerle informed the group that additional CARES reports were sent to the agency, also that educational materials are being drafted. The group also reviewed data related to ketamine administration

during the second quarter of 2022 and the Emergency Triage, Treatment, and Transport (ET3) pilot program.

#### **Health Data Exchange:**

The EMS Agency continues to work with the hospitals to expand access to the health data exchange (HDE). As of now, Natividad will be participating in a meeting in January to discuss the potential expansion of their HDE participation, MEE is still in the process of scheduling time with ESO for a preliminary meeting, and a meeting has been scheduled with CHOMP to discuss the HDE project.

### **Continuing Education Opportunities:**

The EMS Agency held a meeting for paramedic preceptors on December 15, 2022. A majority of the current paramedic preceptors attended in person or through Zoom. The session was well-received by the preceptors who attended. The main focus was the communication of policy, protocol expectations, and documentation for specific circumstances. The discussion was lively, with active participation. The EMS Agency plans to hold two of these meetings each year. Future meetings will continue to highlight specific policies and protocols and add training on effective communication and teaching tools.

Overall, the MHOAC Program activity remained relatively stable throughout the past several months.

#### COVID Data Update as of 01/04/2023:

- <u>Cases and Deaths</u> California has 10,888,090 confirmed cases of COVID-19, resulting in 97,757 confirmed deaths. In Monterey County, there have been 96,380 total confirmed cases of COVID-19, resulting 776 total confirmed deaths.
- <u>Test Positivity and Case Rate</u> In general test positivity and case rate numbers have stabilized since our last report. The current California test positivity rate is at 11.9%. In Monterey County, the current test positivity rate is at 6.9%.
- <u>Hospitalizations</u> Overall, hospitalizations have continued to stabilize since our last report. The current number of hospitalizations due to confirmed COVID-19 cases in California reached a total of 4,561. Local hospitalizations currently stand at 18.
- <u>Vaccination Rate</u> Vaccination rates have not seen significant increases. Currently 72.5% of the eligible population Monterey County is fully vaccinated (this has not changed since our last report). Additionally, 60.7% of the booster-eligible population have received at least one dose of the booster.

The MHOAC program continues to monitor and support COVID-19 mitigation efforts. Governor Newsom has announced that the State of Emergency related to COVID-19 will end effective February 28, 2023. The County/MHOAC and Region are working to identify the impacts that this change will have on authorizations, resource requests, operations, and capabilities.

<u>Monkeypox (MPX)</u>: The MHOAC program continues to support MPX activities, including the coordination of both vaccine and medication for treatment. We also report the status of all deployed bottles of oral tecovirimat (TPOXX) on a monthly basis to the Region/State (CDPH).

<u>Ebola Virus Disease (EVD)</u>: Monterey County Public Health (PH), in collaboration with CDPH and the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), is closely monitoring an outbreak of Ebola Virus Disease (EVD) due to the Sudan Virus in Central Uganda. Travelers from the area are being funneled through five airports, screened at arrival, and, if they are

asymptomatic, they can continue to their destination. Local health departments are then conducting 21 days of monitoring past their last potential exposure. Our Region is working to complete a Regional Infections Disease Transport Plan as well as other guidance related to testing and treatment.

<u>Flu/ILI</u>: We are continuing to monitor local and statewide impacts from this years' flu season. We work closely with PH, EMS providers and local healthcare facilities to monitor system impacts.

Supply and Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) Requests: The MHOAC continues to assist with resource requests (RRs) as a result of the items listed above. Testing supplies are also still available through the MHOAC resource request process. At the direction of CDPH, recent distribution of tests has focused on the support of testing for those people who are uninsured and do not have MediCal, Medicare, or private insurance. Those with insurance are encouraged to utilize these benefits to obtain at-home tests from pharmacies or retail stores.

Resources requests will continue to be available for pick-up only at the County Contracts and Purchasing Department in Salinas. 
<u>Pediatric Patient Surge – Monitoring</u>: The MHOAC program continues to monitor and report weekly pediatric patient surge data.










### Response Time Compliance by Priority




## Response Time Compliance: Green Response Area



## Response Time Compliance: Yellow Response Area


AMR Response Time Compliance By Priority: YELLOW ZONE



On October 27, 2022, the EMS Agency received AMR's request for a rate adjustment of 5% (see attached copy of request). Pursuant to Section 17.2 of Agreement #A-11610 to Provide Advanced Life and Basic Life Support Ambulance Service for the County of Monterey, AMR is entitled to an annual rate increase based on the greater of:

- 1) Two percent (2%) divided by Monterey's average collection rate from the previous 12-month period for which figures are then available; or,
- 2) Percentage calculated from the following CPI Factors divided by the Monterey's average collection rate from the current year. Department of Labor, Bureau of Labor Statistics CPI as of the previous 12-month period for the published figure are then available for the San Francisco-Oakland-San Jose:
  - A. 85% of the Medical Care CPI
  - B. 2% of the Transportation CPI
  - C. 13% of All Items CPI

The EMS Agency reviewed the request for rate adjustment and found that it was consistent with the terms of the agreement. The language in Section 17.2 of the Agreement automatically entitles AMR to the greater of the two options for a rate increase. The calculation described in Option 1 resulted in a rate increase of 4.4%. The calculation described in Option 2 results in a rate increase of 39.7%. Since AMR's request is less than what they are entitled to, the request must go to the Monterey County Board of Supervisors for approval. Pending approval, this adjustment will go into effect on February 1, 2023. Attached is a copy of the proposed Rate Schedule that reflects the 5% increase.

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### **Executive Summary**

The Monterey County Emergency Medical Services (EMS) Agency is a Bureau within the Monterey County Health Department and is designated by the Board of Supervisors as the local emergency medical services agency (LEMSA) for the County of Monterey. The agency's primary responsibilities are to plan, implement, and evaluate an Emergency Medical Services (EMS) system that meets or exceeds the minimum standards developed by the California EMS Authority (EMSA). Key components of this include system monitoring/oversight, medical control, policy/procedure development and implementation, monitoring compliance with laws/regulations, certification/accreditation of EMS personnel, EMS system planning, as well as educational program approval and monitoring.

The mission of the Monterey County EMS Agency is to lead the Monterey County EMS System through establishing highest standards of emergency medical care, system operations, and medical disaster preparedness for the benefit of the people of Monterey County. The Monterey County EMS System is comprised of ground and air ambulance providers, dispatch/communication centers, fire and rescue service providers, hospital emergency departments, specialty care centers for trauma, stroke, and ST elevation myocardial infarction (STEMI) patients, and the Monterey County EMS Agency. The collaborative efforts of these EMS System partners strengthen our ability to provide emergency medical services to citizens of and visitors to Monterey County.

Health and Safety Code, Division 2.5, Section 1797.254, requires Local EMS Agencies (LEMSAs) to submit an EMS Plan to EMSA and provide annual updates thereafter. On August 18, 2020, EMSA issued a memorandum providing an extension to the usual deadline for plan submission. This memorandum granted a 180-day extension from the date of cessation of the State's declared emergency on the coronavirus pandemic for submission of EMS plans. On December 14, 2020, EMSA issued a subsequent memorandum rescinding the August 18, 2020 memorandum and providing additional clarification regarding the deadline extension. On July 13, 2022, EMSA issued a third memorandum announcing that the December 14, 2020 memorandum was to be rescinded as of August 1, 2022. The latest memorandum required LEMSAs to submit their annual plans by January 31, 2023.

This plan submission updates the most recent plan for Monterey County which covered calendar year 2018. The Monterey County EMS Agency submitted this plan on May 8, 2019 and EMSA approved the plan on September 5, 2019. This document represents the 2019 through 2021 annual updates of the Monterey County EMS Agency.

Despite the challenges associated with the response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Monterey County EMS Agency completed several accomplishments and system improvements during the period covered by this document. Key accomplishments included:

Completed annual updates of our policies and treatment protocols. We also greatly
expanded our policy and protocol development cycle plan to significantly increase
educational outreach efforts and opportunities for stakeholder input.

- Instituted multiple procedure and protocol changes related to EMS System needs regarding the COVID-19 pandemic. These efforts included working with receiving facilities to implement standardized isolation procedures for EMS turnover to hospital staff, implementation of communications center screening protocols, and development of processes for provider notifications of potential exposures to the virus.
- Approval of a local optional scope of practice (LOSOP) application and implementation of a Unified Scope of Practice for flight-based Paramedics to standardize their scope of practice across county lines.
- Approval of a LOSOP application and implementation of a protocol permitting the administration of tranexamic acid (TXA) to critically injured trauma patients.
- Approval of a LOSOP application and implementation of policies permitting EMS providers to conduct COVID-19 and Influenza testing and vaccination administration.
- Creation of a Data Utilization and Governance Policy that established standards for sharing data between our various agencies and facilitated efforts to provide enhance patient outcome information to our prehospital providers.
- Expanding the number of hospitals providing patient follow up information via our electronic patient care documentation system's Health Data Exchange capabilities.
- Implementation of a leave behind naloxone program allowing Paramedics and EMTs to distribute to those patients who had a suspected opioid overdose and refused transport.
- Fulfilled the role of the Medical Health Operational Coordinator (MHOAC) and maintained a 24-hour-per-day, 365-days-per-year single point of contact for the program.
- Worked with Monterey County's IT Department to develop, implement, and improve an online resource request form for submitting supply and resource need.
- Coordinated over 2,000 resource requests from a wide range of healthcare organizations, governmental agencies, service providers, and community-based organizations. Most of these requests included multiple different items.
- Served as the primary conduit for laboratory supplies necessary for COVID-19 testing, monoclonal antibody infusion products, personnel to fulfill staffing needs, and a diverse variety of other supplies/equipment to aid in the response throughout our operational area.
- Responded to and coordinated evacuations related to significant wildfires that occurred within Monterey County.
- Began working with providers to transition to a secure, electronic submittal of claims related to Monterey County's Emergency Medical Services Fund (EMSF) under Section 1797.98 of the Health and Safety Code (Maddy Fund).
- Established a Maddy Reserve Fund to ensure that physicians and hospitals continue to receive reimbursement for a portion of their services regardless of the amount of revenue generated from the assessment.
- Modified the response to unconfirmed medical alarm calls made by medical alarm companies to receive a first responder response only and leaving ambulances available in the EMS System.
- Reached an agreement for access to the Cardiac Arrest Registry to Enhance Survival (CARES) database.

- Secured access to the Trauma One trauma registry software that contains follow up information on patients who sustained traumatic injuries and were transported to Monterey County's trauma center, Natividad Medical Center.
- Completed a survey of our stakeholders related to continuing education offerings and training needs which resulted in the establishment of a continuing education series hosted by the Monterey County EMS Agency's Medical Director.
- Began working with a local consortium to initiate a paramedic training program in Monterey County to address the need for additional paramedics in our EMS System.

We thank our EMS service providers, emergency dispatchers, hospital personnel, emergency management personnel, and community throughout Monterey County who have demonstrated their commitment to supporting the Monterey County EMS System and helping to make these improvements possible in our ongoing effort to meet the needs of our community.







#### RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC) find, pursuant to AB 361, that the COVID-19 pandemic state of emergency declared by Governor Newsom is still in effect; the EMCC has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency; and the Monterey County Health Officer continues to recommend social distancing measures for meetings of legislative bodies.

#### SUMMARY/DISCUSSION

On September 16, 2021, Governor Newsom signed AB 361. This legislation amends the Brown Act to allow meeting bodies subject to the Brown Act to meet via teleconference during a proclaimed state of emergency in accordance with teleconference procedures established by AB 361 rather than under the Brown Act's more narrow standard rules for participation in a meeting by teleconference. AB 361 provides that if a state or local health official recommends social distancing, the EMCC may meet remotely after September 30, 2021, provided that within 30 days of the first meeting after September 30, and every 30 days thereafter, the EMCC finds 1) the Governor's proclaimed state of emergency is still in effect; 2) the EMCC has reconsidered the circumstances of the state of emergency, and 3) the Monterey County Health Officer continues to recommend social distancing measures for meetings of legislative bodies or the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet in person.

The Monterey County Health Officer has recommended social distancing measures for meetings of legislative bodies, so the EMCC was able to meet remotely the first time after September 30, 2021. In order to continue meeting remotely, the EMCC must make the findings outlined above.

Accordingly, staff recommends making the appropriate findings. This action will be required every 30 days in order to keep meeting remotely; a special meeting may be necessary for that purpose.

Subject: Policy and Practice Update: Termination of the COVID-19 State of

**Emergency Effective February 28, 2023** 

Governor Gavin Newsom announced that the COVID-19 State of Emergency will end on February 28, 2023. In response to the termination of the State of Emergency, the California Emergency Medical Services Authority (EMSA) issued a memorandum outlining the resulting policy changes (see <u>EMSA Memorandum dated October 17, 2022</u>). The Monterey County EMS Agency has reviewed the impact of these changes on local policies and practices. The following changes will take place, effective February 28<sup>th</sup>, 2023.

### **COVID-19 and Influenza Vaccination Administration**

- Paramedics and Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs) may not administer COVID-19 or influenza vaccinations.
- Monterey County EMS System Policy #4513 (Paramedic Vaccination Administration) is rescinded.
- Monterey County EMS System Policy #4514 (EMT Vaccination Administration) is rescinded.

#### **COVID-19 and Influenza Testing**

- Paramedics and EMTs may not conduct oropharyngeal and/or nasopharyngeal COVID-19 and influenza testing.
- Monterey County EMS System Policy #2351 (Specimen Collection COVID-19 Nasal Swab) is rescinded.

#### **Practice in Static Settings/Sites**

 Paramedics and EMTs may not perform their current scope of practice in hospitals, medical facilities, alternate care sites, shelter care sites, in-home settings, or any additional setting (static sites).

### **Authorization of Out-Of-State Medical Personnel**

Health care providers licensed out-of-state who received the EMSA's authorization to
practice in the state without a license issued by the pertinent California licensing Board
will no longer be permitted to practice.

### **Paramedic Skills Competency Verification**

- All paramedic service providers and Paramedics accredited in Monterey County shall comply with Monterey County EMS System Policy #6090 (Annual Skills Maintenance Verification and Policy Review).
- Each Paramedic reaccrediting in Monterey County shall submit a completed Monterey County EMS Form #6091 (Annual Skills and Policy Review Form) for each year of the reaccreditation cycle after the expiration of the State of Emergency.

### **Quality Improvement Plan Submission**

- Annual quality improvement (QI) plan updates from providers and base hospitals are due no later than May 30, 2023 (90 days from the date of cessation of the COVID-19 State of Emergency). Data submitted with this update should cover October to December 2019 and the full calendar years of 2020, 2021, and 2022.
- Going forward, all provider and base hospital annual QI plan updates will be due on January 31<sup>st</sup> of each year and will include data for the prior calendar year.

### **EMS Advisory Committee Meetings**

- The end of the COVID-19 State of Emergency also brings about the suspension of A.B. 361's modifications to the Brown Act's rules and restrictions surrounding the use of teleconferencing to conduct meetings.
- Beginning with the March 2023 meetings, committee members of the EMS Agency's Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC), Medical Advisory Subcommittee (MAC), and the EMS Operations Subcommittee (OPS) will be required to attend all meetings in person.


