## V. Agricultural Commissioner's Update

Jose Chang, Assistant Agricultural Commissioner

- On 2.3.2022, distribution event in King City. Distributed 8,952 bottles of hand sanitizers, 512,000 surgical masks, and 48,000 N95 respirators- Serving 30 growers, 27 Farm Labor Contractors, and 1 PCB
- On 2.10.2022, held second distribution even in Salinas distributing: 17,256 bottles of hand sanitizers- Serving 42 growers, seven Farm Labor Contractors and 1 PCB
- Ca Dept of Pesticide Regulations is in early development of statewide system providing info to the public about pesticides around them. On 2.3.2022, CDPR announced voluntary partnership with four County Ag Commissioners- Riverside, Santa Cruz, Stanislaus, and Ventura- to launch a pilot project to support DPR development of a statewide pesticide application notification system. Pilot program to launch between February to July 2022 and will help inform the design and implementation of this notification system.
- I reported an ACP find last time, no new finds to report this time around and our office has taken over the servicing of the traps 113 traps.
