Re: SB 642 (Cortese) Hazardous materials: enforcement: county counsel. - SUPPORT

Dear Senator Cortese:

The County of Monterey is pleased to support your measure Senate Bill (SB) 642. This bill will help protect the public from pollution and deter unfair business practices by giving county counsels full civil enforcement authority over hazardous materials violations.

Health and Safety Code section 25182 provides that civil actions under the Hazardous Waste Control Act may be brought by the city attorney, district attorney, Attorney General, or the "county attorney," including county counsels. However, several related enforcement statutes necessary for fully exercising this authority do not apply to county counsels. As a result, county counsels have jurisdiction in most hazardous waste violation cases but generally do not bring suit because of their incomplete enforcement authority.

SB 642 seeks to follow through on the Legislature's intent to add another hazardous waste enforcement option by granting county counsels complete civil enforcement authority over hazardous waste violations.
