REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about December 8, 2021, the County of Monterey will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of \$70,000 in Community Development Block Grants/Entitlement Grants, as authorized by the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, Title I, Part 24, Section 570, Public Law 93-383, 88 Stat. 633, 42 U.S.C 5301-5321, as amended, to undertake a project known as the North County Recreation & Park District Recreation Center Heating and Ventilation Modernization project and Crane St. Park Lighting for the purpose of improving recreational opportunities in predominately low-moderate income community.

The North Monterey County Recreation and Park District will use CDBG funds to replace a non-operational heating system at the District Recreation Center located at 11261 Crane St., Castroville, CA 95012); and remove and replace the existing sprinkler system and play structure and install solar powered lights at a District playground located at 11771 Crane St., Castroville, CA 95012.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The County of Monterey has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The County of Monterey certifies to HUD that Anastacia Wyatt, Housing Program Manager, Housing and Community Development Department, in her capacity as certifying officer consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the County of Monterey to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the County of Monterey's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the County of Monterey; (b) the County of Monterey has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to HUD Region IX, Attn: Kimberly Nash, Director, Community Planning and Development, U.S. HUD Region IX, 1 Sansome Street, Suite 1200, San Francisco, CA 94104 or CPD_COVID-190EE-SFO@hud.gov.
