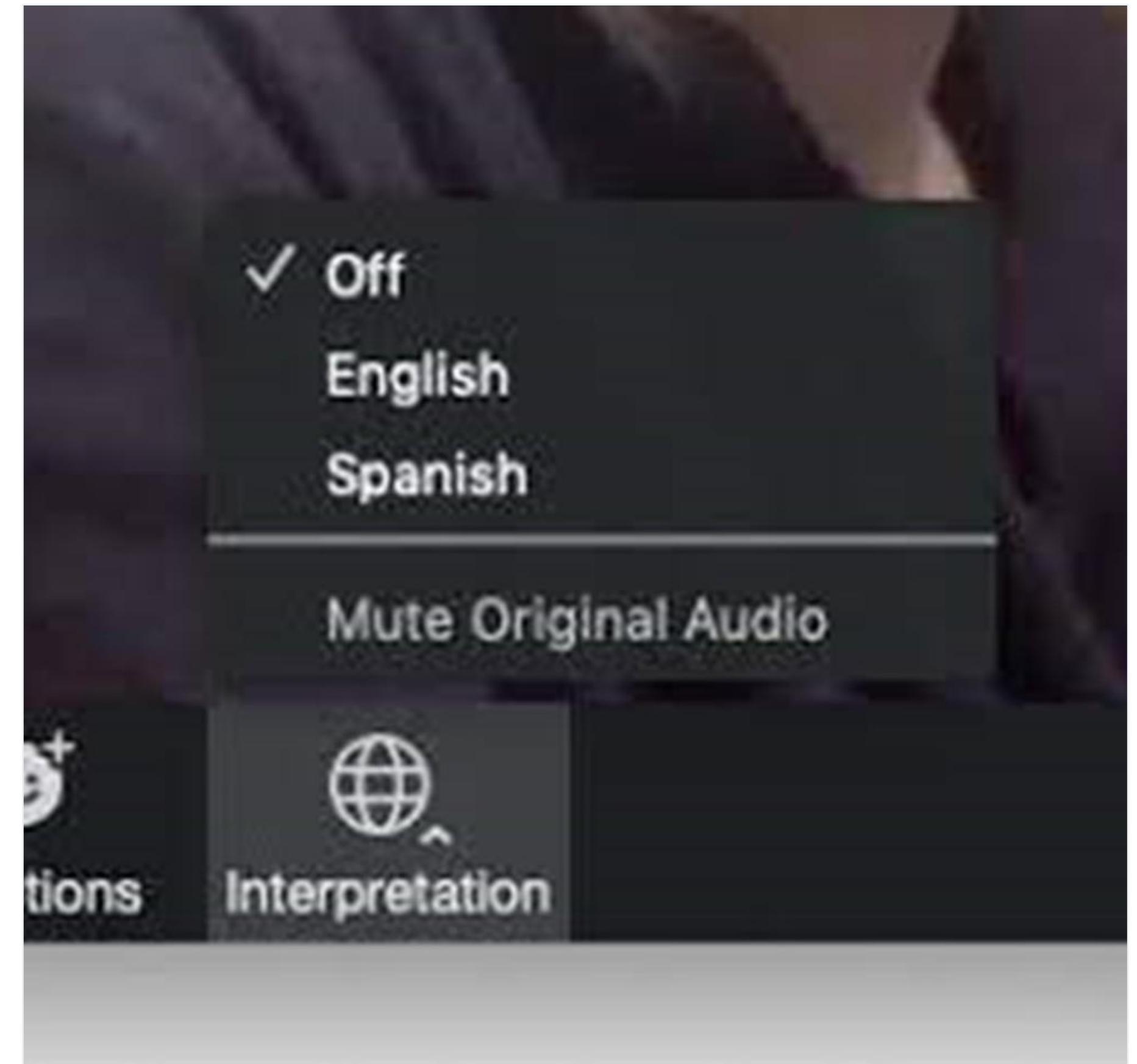

WHAT IS ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE?

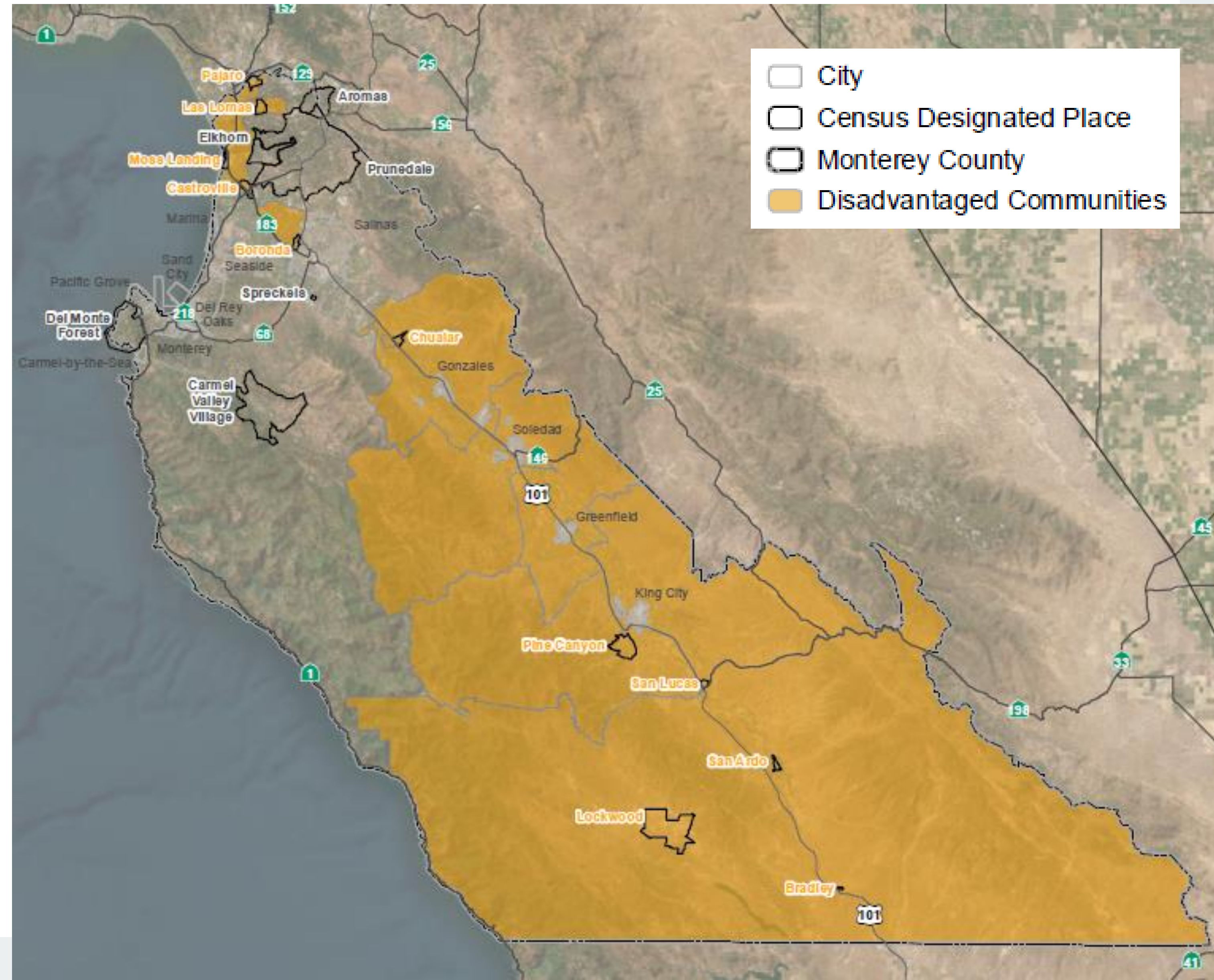
Environmental Justice is defined in California Law as the fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

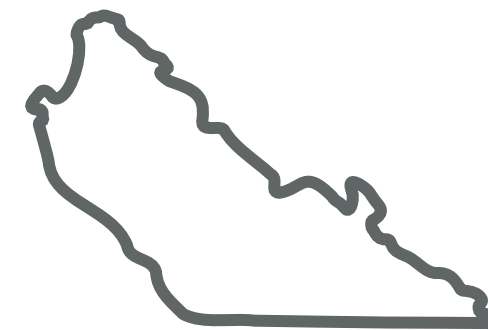

STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

Senate Bill (SB) 1000 requires jurisdictions to identify DACs and incorporate environmental justice policies into the General Plan upon adoption of two or more Elements concurrently on or after January 1, 2018

SB 1000 has seven primary objectives

Improve Access to Public Facilities



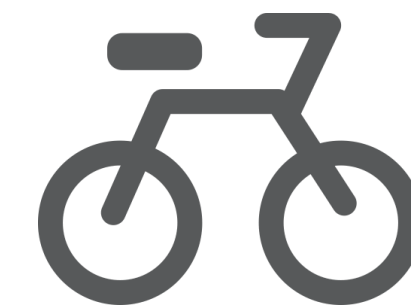

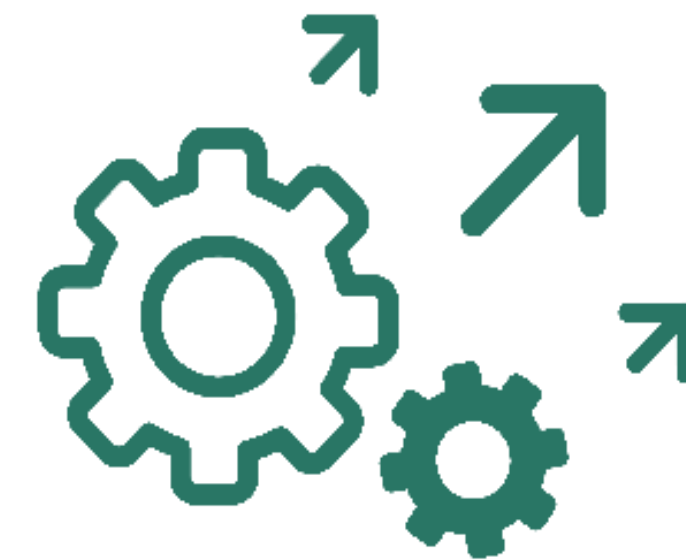

Input on the draft Environmental Justice goals and policies



ROLES AND EXPECTATIONS OF THE EJCAC:

Provide feedback and make recommendations on draft materials

Meet four times to identify and review existing conditions and feasible policy and/or strategy recommendations

Provide feedback on objectives and policies and recommend additional policies and strategies that address inequities, if necessary

Liaise with community and/or organization members

Identify constraints to implement selected policies and strategies

May be removed from the EJCAC if disrupting the meeting

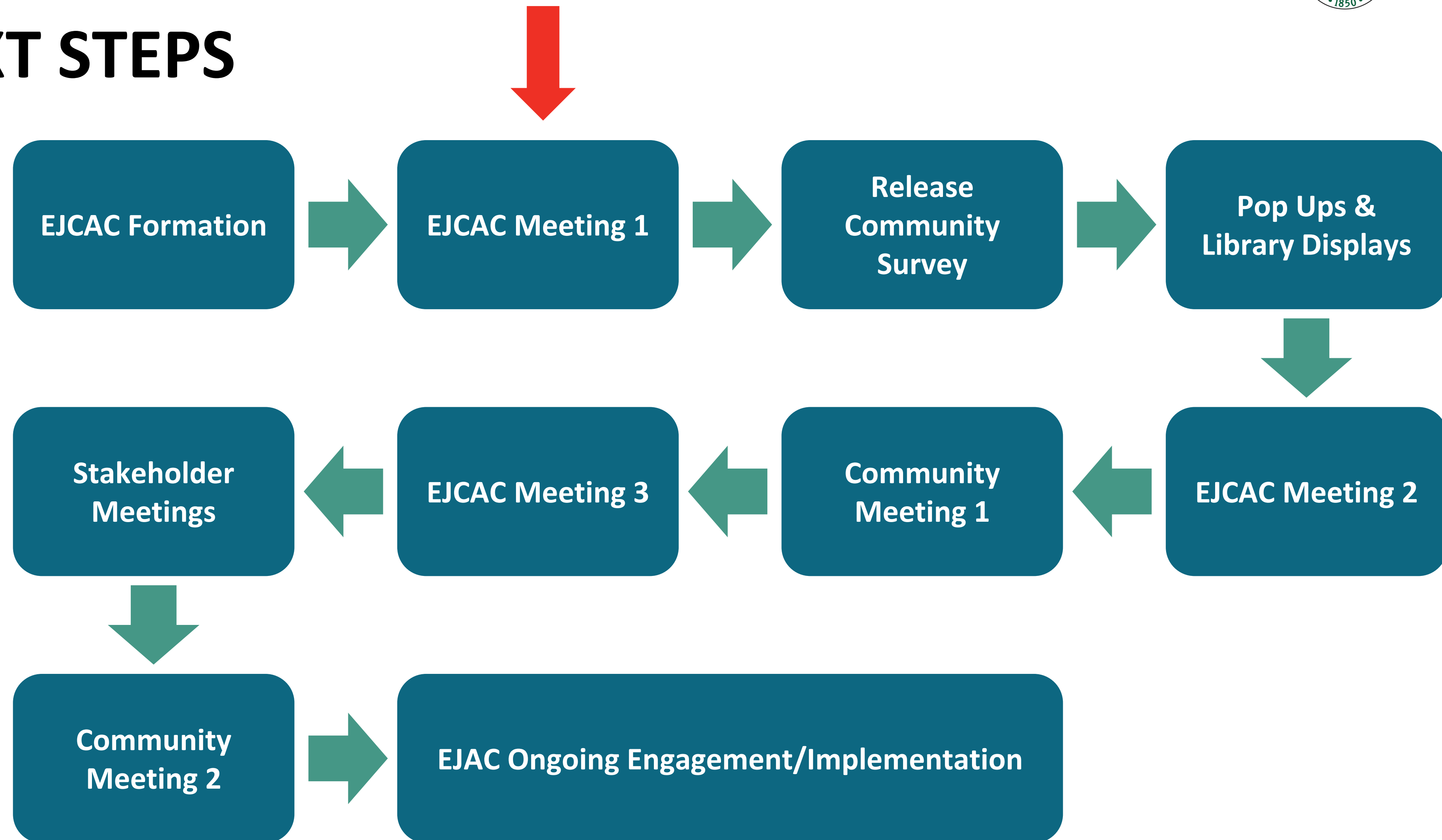
