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Narrative: On September 13, 2023, our office received a notification regarding a fuel spill that occured at Woodward Marine in Moss Landing on Tuesday, September 12, 2023. I visited the site to follow-up and met Megan Wingrove of Woodward Marine (Reporting Party). Megan led me to the fuel pumping area by the dock, showed me where the diesel fuel spill occurred, and indicated that they began cleaning up the spill as soon as they realized it was occurring. The incident was caused when Dept. of Fish & Wildlife personnel, while pumping fuel to their boat, walked away and left the dispenser unattended. Marine Woodward personnel responded right away and shut down the pumps. They deployed their booms and absorbent pads to contain the fuel spil in the water and the dock. They stored the recovered cleanup booms and absorbents in their hazardous waste storage area, which is scheduled to ship out as hazardous waste. I confirmed the cleanup has been completed.
