Narrative: On August 14th around 5:00 pm, PG&E's EHS team found drops of insulating oil on soil below a leaking transformer located on W. Blanco Rd., and Cooper Rd. The oil leak also reached a ditch with stagnant water where algae captured approximately 2 gallons of oil. PG&E's team responded by placing absorbent material on soil and an absorbent pad on the water surface to collect the oil on surface. A third-party vendor, Clean Harbors was hired to dispose of oily soil and water on August 15th around 5:00 pm, which is when scene was cleared. No additional follow up required. Notification to Cal-OES, local health department and other agencies were made on 8/15/2023.
