


What Does Your County Veteran Service Office Do?



- Support, assist, and advocate for all Veterans, Active Servicemembers, Guard/Reserve, Retirees, Survivors, and Dependents
- Benefits counseling, claims development and submission- We are the County's <u>accredited connection</u> to the VA
- FY 21/22- MVAO served 2,929 unique Veterans, filed 6,009 claim actions, and was awarded 1,805 VA Disability Compensation claims totaling nearly \$3.5M in retroactive payments and over \$7.3M in recurring monthly compensation to County of Monterey Veterans
- 19,031 Veterans in the County of Monterey, however <u>only 30%</u> receive or use VA benefits
