Veteran Home Update,	 The press rally idea was brought forth by
Jack Murphy:	Supervisor Alejo in the last MVAAC meeting.
	The idea was to prompt some form of action
	going into the next spring legislative session. It
	will hopefully compel CAL VET to study the need
	in the State for an additional CAL VET Veteran
	Home. The closest home to Monterey County
	being Fresno or Yountville. There is a need
	within the Veteran community. The Central
	Coast has over 130,000 Veterans, more than
	half being over the age of 55. Jason Cameron
	(VSO) and I have held numerous meetings with
	CAL VET leadership. They do not see the need
	for an additional Veterans Home. The demand
	and lack of beds results in a wait time of 1 to 6
	years. Secretary Panetta, Representative
	Panetta, District 1 & 4 Supervisors spoke at the
	event.

Supervisor Alejo	 Thanked the Monterey County Military and Veterans Affairs Office, Chair Williams and Commissioners for heading, speaking, and attending the press rally this morning. We needed to show that local Veteran leaders support this initiative. Several press outlets covered the event. I feel this event was a success because we accomplished the goal of elevating this issue to our State and Federal Elected Officials. The future goal being having State legislation introduced this upcoming year. Supervisor Alejo also thanked Candice King who provided a testimonial of her caring for her Veteran Father during his end-of-life stages. Dan Presser comment: We have had several instances in the community of Veterans in need. We need to continue to bring these services home to Monterey County. Supervisor Alejo responded that we will provide a summary of the media coverage to get the stories out to our Elected Officials. Jack Murphy thanked the Veterans Transition Center maintenance staff for staging the event.
