Committee Reports

Veteran Home Update, • Jack Murphy:	 Since our Last meeting we have received several additional Letters of Support for the Veterans Home from various municipalities: Morro Bay, Scotts Valley, City of San Mateo, and City of San Luis Obispo. Asm. Addis was assigned to the Assembly Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.
Supervisor Alejo	 I have been elected as the Chair of the Board of Supervisors this year. We have been working on legislation with State elected officials. Unfortunately, we have not been able to have a State Representative introduce legislation for the Veterans Home yet. We are hoping to have one introduced in the future.

State Legislation Report

 Representative from Asm. Rivas' office, Dominic Dursa reported: Committee hearings are being held on legislative bills that have been introduced this session.

Farr and Jack Stewart Awards.

- AB 46, introduced by Assemblymember Ramos related to the taxation of pensions of veterans in California. The bill has significant co-authors, some 30 assembly members from a bipartisan coalition have signed on, as well as several Senators.
- You may have heard reports of troubles with California's budget this year. The Governor's budget was introduced in January and projected a nearly \$22 billion deficit.
- The legislative analyst's office is projecting that that deficit may look even worse, and probably even hit upwards of \$30 billion.
- What this means is, if there are certain budget priorities or programs that you are passionate about and are worried that they may be on the chopping block, make sure to stay in touch with any of our offices to relay those concerns.
 - Chair Williams question:
 - Has a bill regarding the Veterans Home been introduced?
 - Dominic Dursa responded: Not at this time.

State Legislation Report • Representative from Sen. Lairds' office, Justin Tran reported:	 AB 46 is heading to the Committee on Revenue and Taxes on Monday. Some of the Senator's bills have been put forward including the one on battery storage in Moss Landing. We are still accepting applications for community funding through the end of this month.
Representative from Asm. Addis' office, Alexis Garcia reported:	Asm. Addis re-introduced AB 444, The Military Defense Infrastructure Bill. The bill would create a way for the State to pull down Federal dollars to benefit the California Military communities by investing in infrastructure around State Military bases. This would include transportation, schools, hospitals, police, and emergency response. This bill is supported by the Monterey Bay Defense Alliance.

Federal Legislation Report

- Representative from Representative Panetta's Office, Xochitl Guerrero reported:
- We currently have the Community Project
 Funding list to appropriate funds to specific
 items of interest within the community. If you
 have any questions or requests, please let me
 know and I will email you the requirements and
 forms.
- We have begun the NDAA process which includes a review of the Gourley Clinic.
- Congressman Panetta co-introduced a bill which would increase Veteran access to Congressional services. This bill would make VA workspaces available for Congressional case workers.
 - Louise Goetzelt question:
 - Is the Richard Star Act on this upcoming NDAA?
 - Xochitl responded: I do not have that information today; I will follow up.
 - Supervisor Alejo comment:
 - Congressman Panetta introduced a bill that would give late honors of the Congressional Medal of Freedom to Commander Everett Alvarez who was born in Salinas. He was the first pilot shot down in Vietnam and was captivity for eight years.

Military and Veterans Affairs Report,

Jack Murphy reported:

- The VA is drawing down on COVID protocols.
 - Jack Murphy question:
 - Has there been any progress in the selection of a new Director for VA Palo Alto.
 - Kintina responded that the recruitment was under way. She mentioned that Jean Gurga is

- the Interim-Director until the position is filled. She is coming from the VA Regional Medical Facility in Kansas City.
- Jack also mentioned wanting to set up a future meeting for community complaints: VA Staffing issues, wait times, pharmacy.
- Louise Goetzelt comment:
- She praised the Oculus who issues the prescribed glasses. She commented on the VA changing its policy to limit the choices of glasses.
 - Dan Presser comment:
 - You can only be prescribed glasses from the VA if you see their ophthalmologist. At any other office, you can take any prescription and get glasses.
