State Legislation Report	AB 46, introduced by Assemblymember Ramos
Representative from Asm. Rivas' office, Dominic Dursa reported:	related to the taxation of pensions of veterans in California. The bill has significant co-authors, some 30 assembly members from a bipartisan coalition have signed on, as well as several Senators. The deadline for it to come out of Committee is the 19th. Please get any Letters if Support in as soon as you can.  • Dan Presser question:  • Is there a good shot that this passes with the current budget outlook?  • Dominic responded that there are significantly more coauthors than in previous years. I can check with Asm. Ramos' office to see if they have any updates.  • Jack explained AB 684 which is a bill that would provide state funds to the Veterans Service Offices across California to have a dedicated Veteran Services Representative to Active-Duty Military Installations. It is currently in Committee.  • The Governor's budget revision should be

#### **State Legislation Report**

• Representative from Asm. Addis' office, Alexis Garcia-Arrazola reported:

- Asm. Addis re-introduced AB 444, The Military
  Defense Infrastructure Bill. The bill would create
  a way for the State to pull down Federal dollars
  to benefit the California Military communities by
  investing in infrastructure around State Military
  bases. This would include transportation,
  schools, hospitals, police, and emergency
  response. This bill is supported by the Monterey
  Bay Defense Alliance. This bill passed out of the
  Military and Veterans Affairs Committee.
- Asm. Addis was also an Aye vote on AB 531, 1386.
- AB 531 is the Veterans Housing and Homeless Prevention Bond Act of 2024 which, if passed, would allow California voters to decide whether to allocate \$600 million in bonds to provide affordable housing to Veterans.
- AB 1386 would increase the income level threshold for housing voucher eligibility under the Veterans Housing and Homeless Prevention Program.

#### **Federal Legislation Report**

• Jack Murphy reported:

- We are continuing to have conversations with Congressman Panetta's Office in reference to the ongoing issue of a lack of a pharmacy at the VA Clinic. We are hoping to have items added to the NDAA to have the Inspector General look into the issue of the Pharmacy.
  - Dan Presser comment:
  - We need to press the pharmacy issue because many Veterans have had issues with prescriptions.

#### Military and Veterans Affairs Report,

• Jack Murphy reported:

- Jack explained MVAO's Fiscal Year to Date report, see attached:
- Jack explained MVAO's hiring of Nancy Hood as Veteran Services Representative. We are currently backfilling her Office Assistant position.
- Jack explained that MVAO is facing a \$203,000 budget cut in the future and would appreciate any support from the Community before the budget vote in June.
