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Narrative: Randy McMurray, Hazardous Materials Management Supervisor forwarded OES Spill report 23-7140 regarding a fuel sheen observed by Monterey Bay Boatworks staff from the vessel Lone Star. The United States Coast Guard (USCG) upon arrival took over incident command from Monterey Bay Boatworks. The volume is undetermined, but remedial action was taken per the report, and according to Monterey Bay Boatworks employee Eddie Bryant, one 55-gallon drum was filled with spent absorbent booms and pads. This drum will be stored at the 32 Cannery Row location for future disposal. USCG and Department of Fish and Wildlife left the scene at approximately 2:30 pm per Mr. Bryant.
