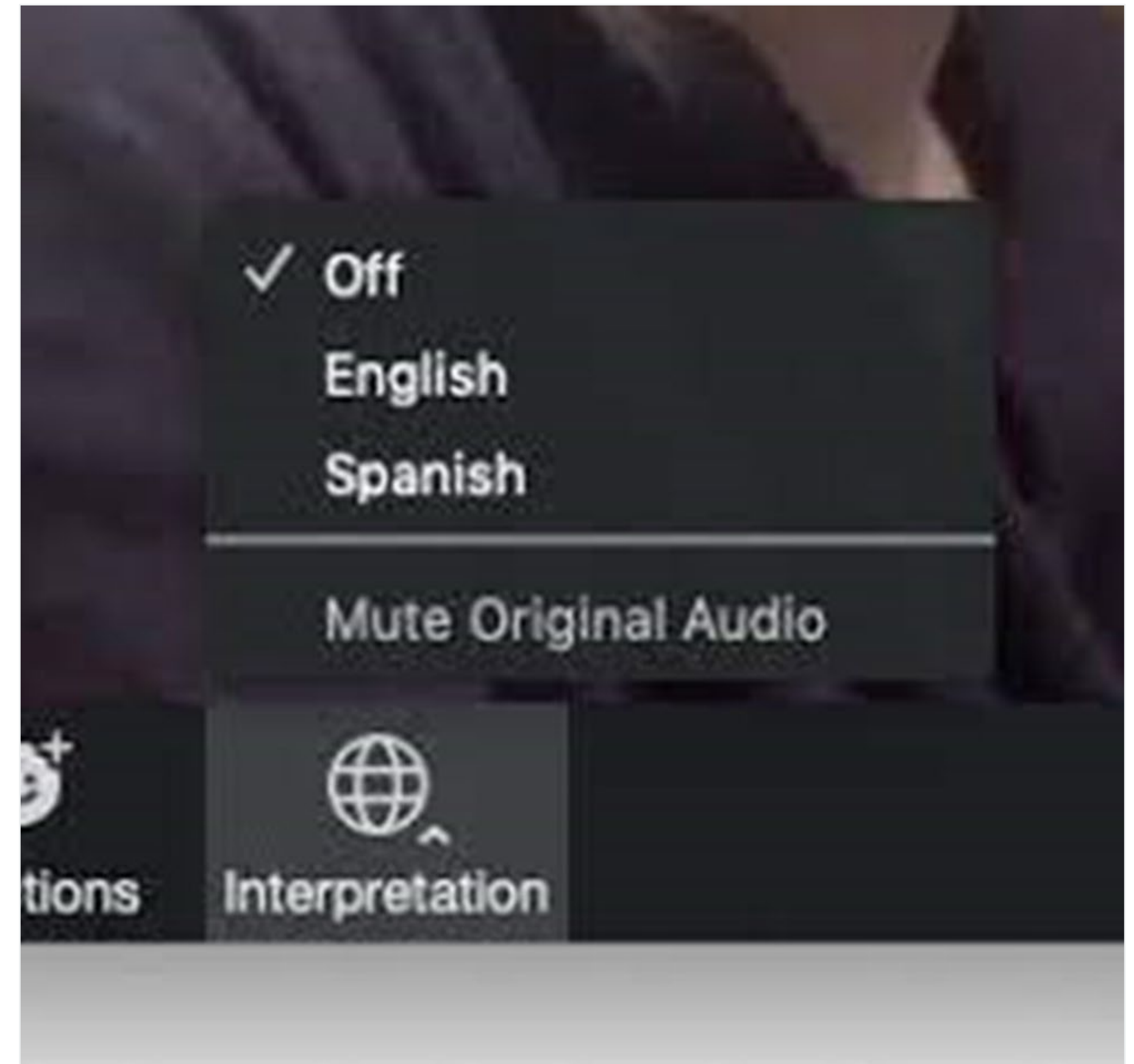

WHAT IS A SAFETY ELEMENT?

The Safety Element is a required general plan element that assesses hazard risk and defines objectives and policies to:



Protect the health, safety, and welfare of the community



Address public safety hazards, including climate change



Build resilience, preparedness, and responsiveness to hazards



SAFETY ELEMENT PROCESS

Risk Assessment

- Confirm hazards of concern
- Provide information on adaptive capacity
- Confirm evacuation scenarios and define evacuation routes

Goal and Strategy Development

- Draft goals, policies, and strategies that
 - a) minimize risk associated with potential hazards,
 - b) increase climate adaptation/resiliency and
 - c) build capacity to respond to hazard events

Plan Review and Adoption

- Update goals, objectives, and policies based on feedback

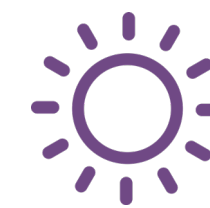

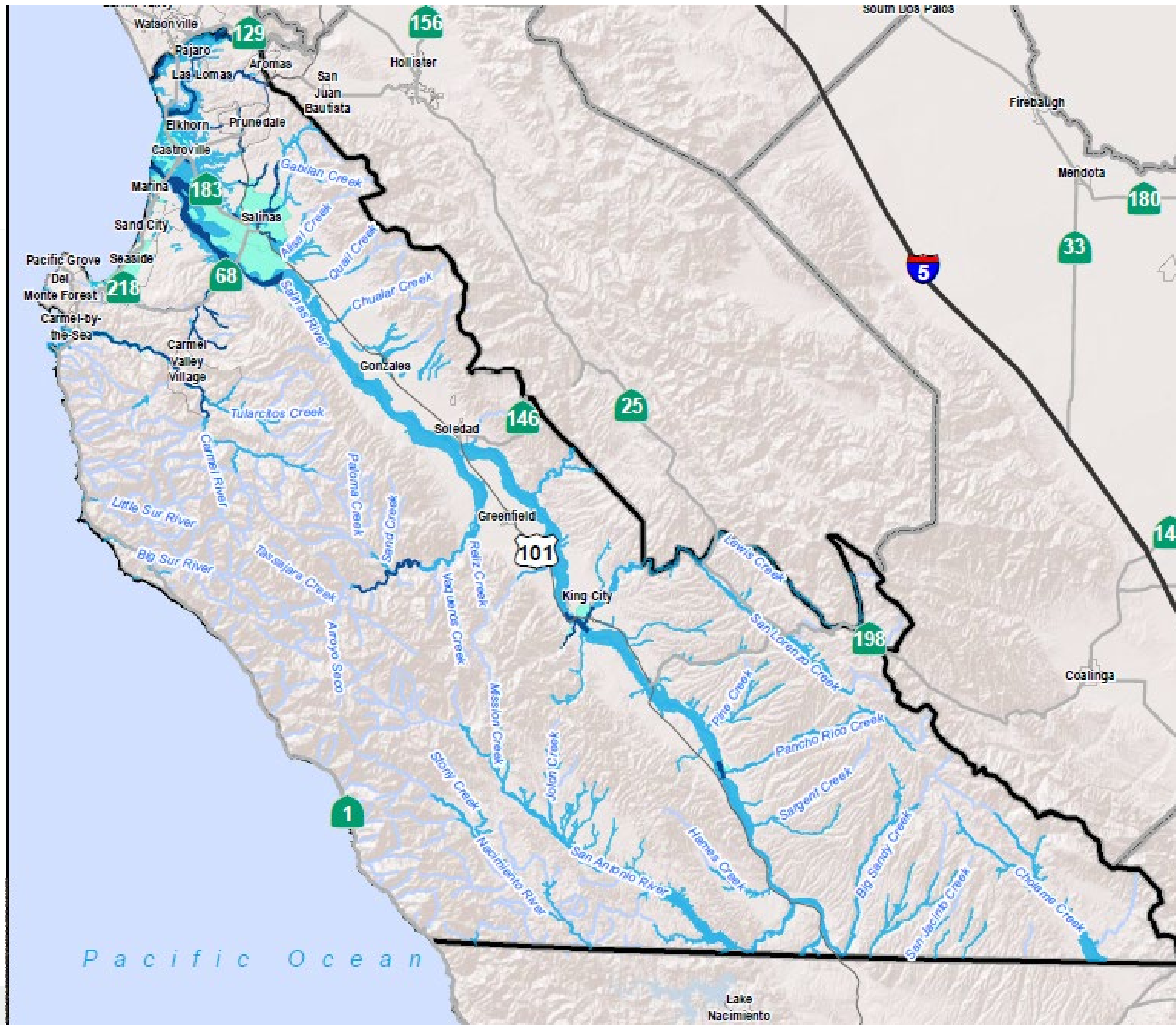

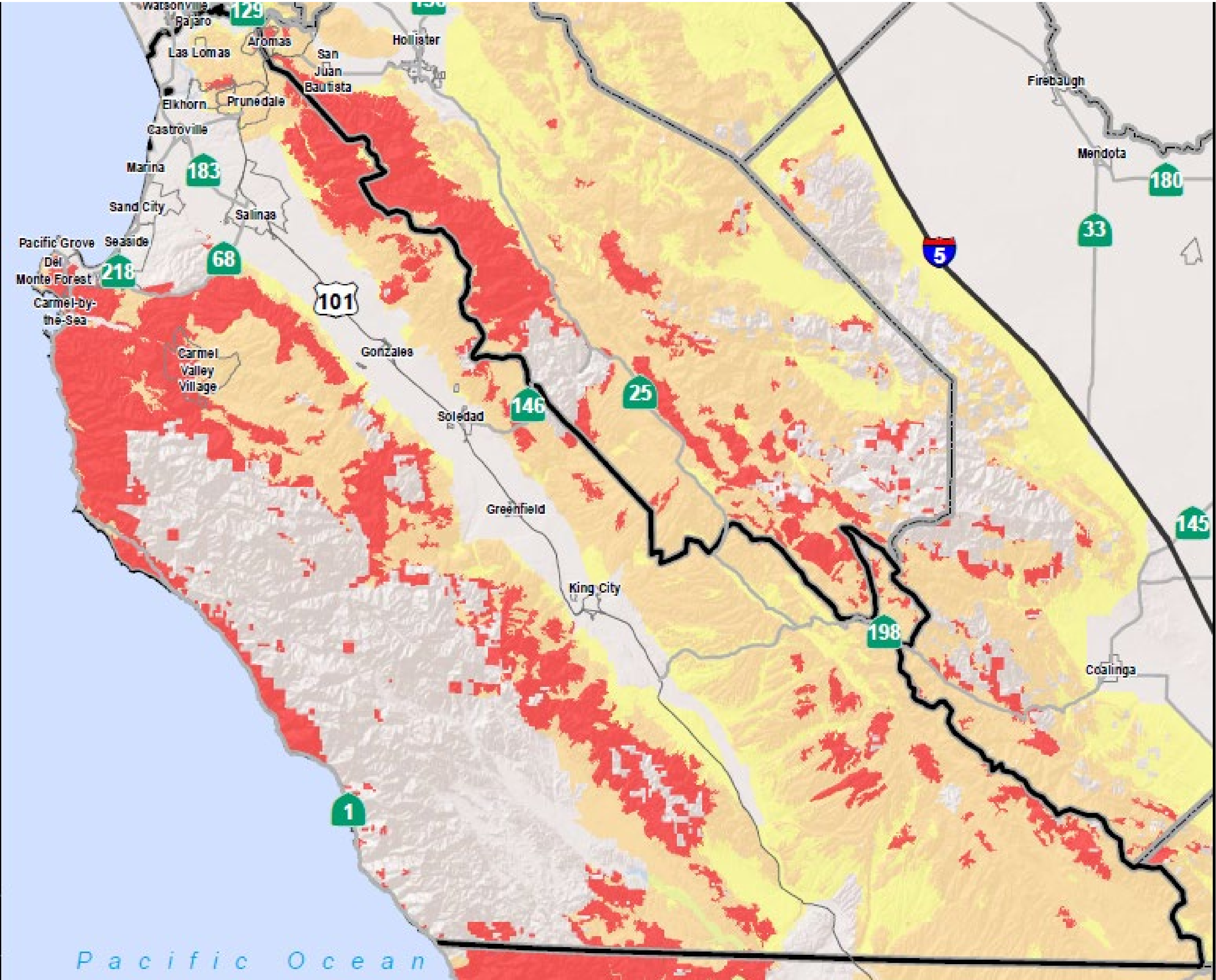

EMERGENCY EVACUATION ROUTE ANALYSIS

Requires local governments to identify evacuation routes and evaluate their capacity, safety, and viability under a range of emergency scenarios.

(AB 747)

➤ **Evaluate evacuation routes**

Requires local governments to identify residential developments in hazard areas that do not have at least two emergency evacuation routes.

(SB 99)

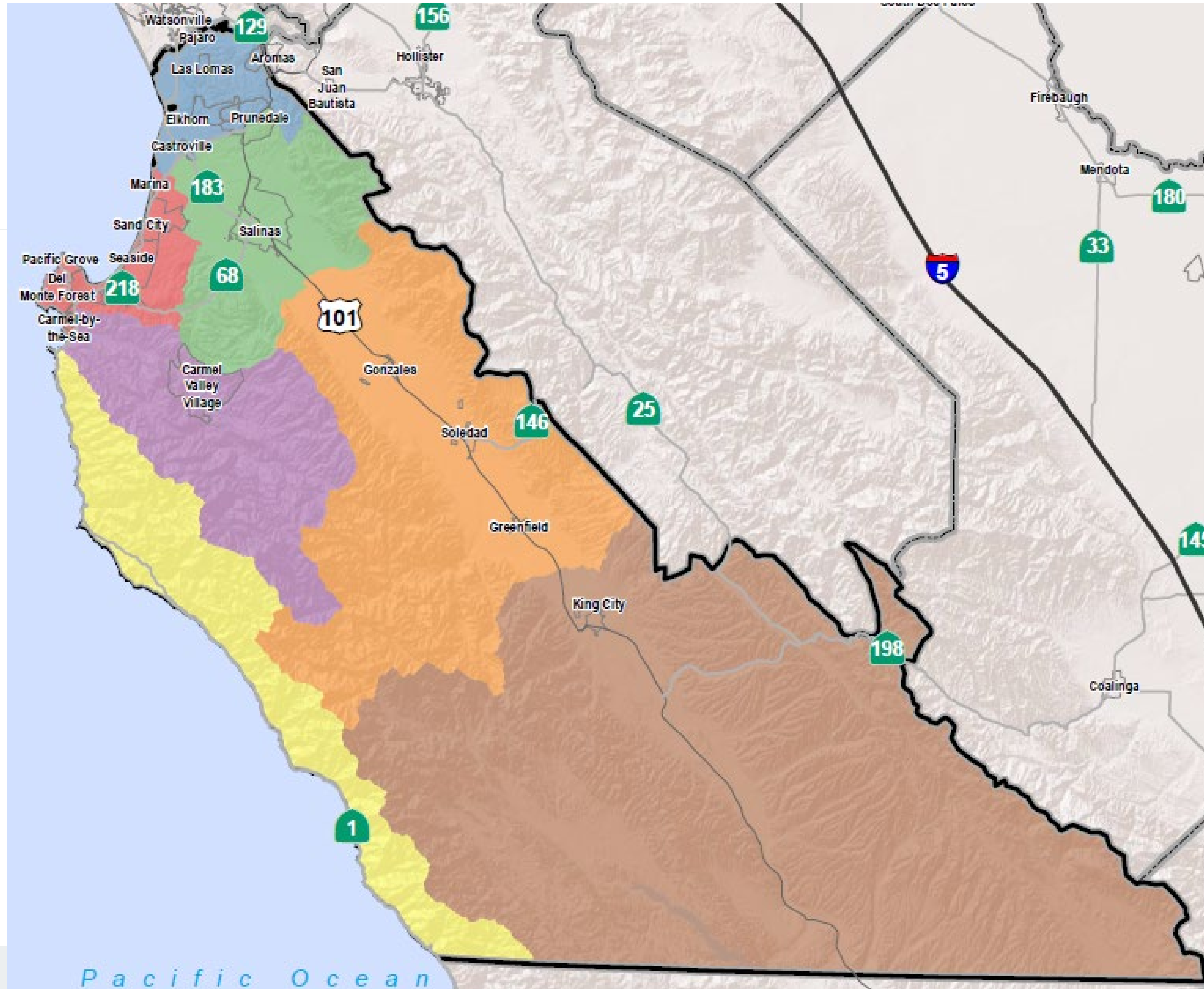
➤ **Identify neighborhoods with limited accessibility**

Requires local governments to identify evacuation locations.

(AB 1409)

➤ **Identify evacuation locations**

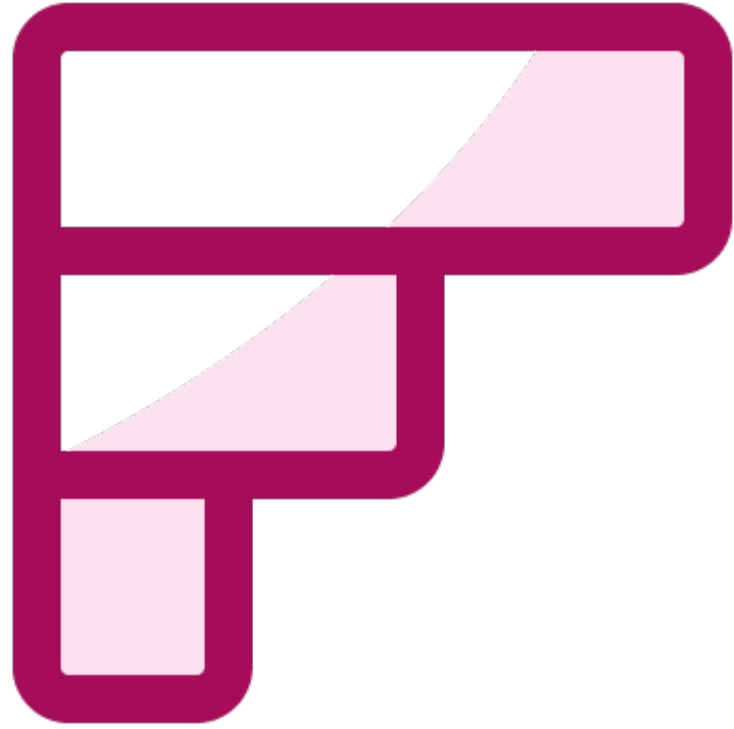

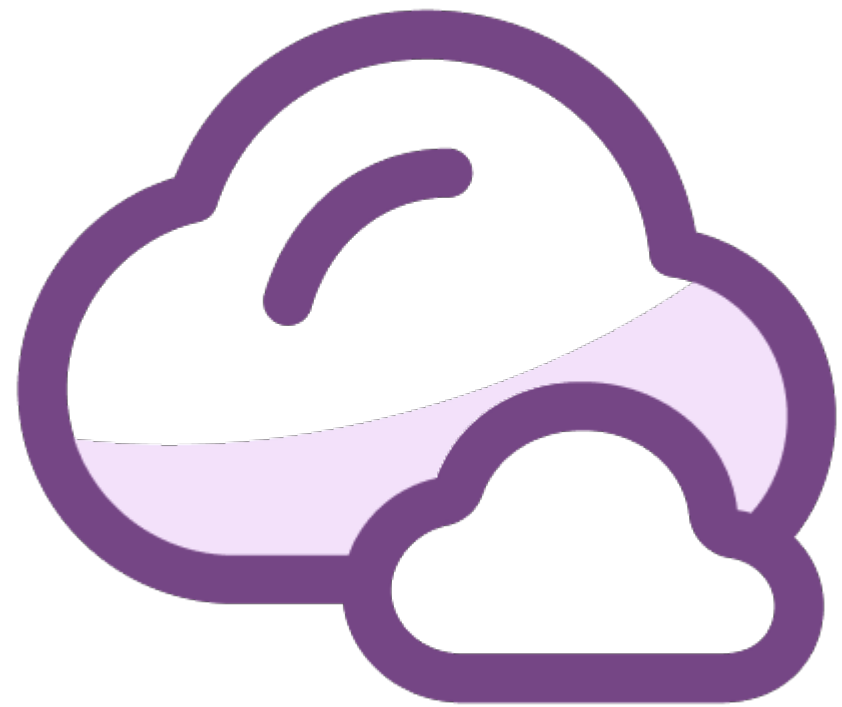

WHAT IS ENVIRONMENTAL JUSTICE?

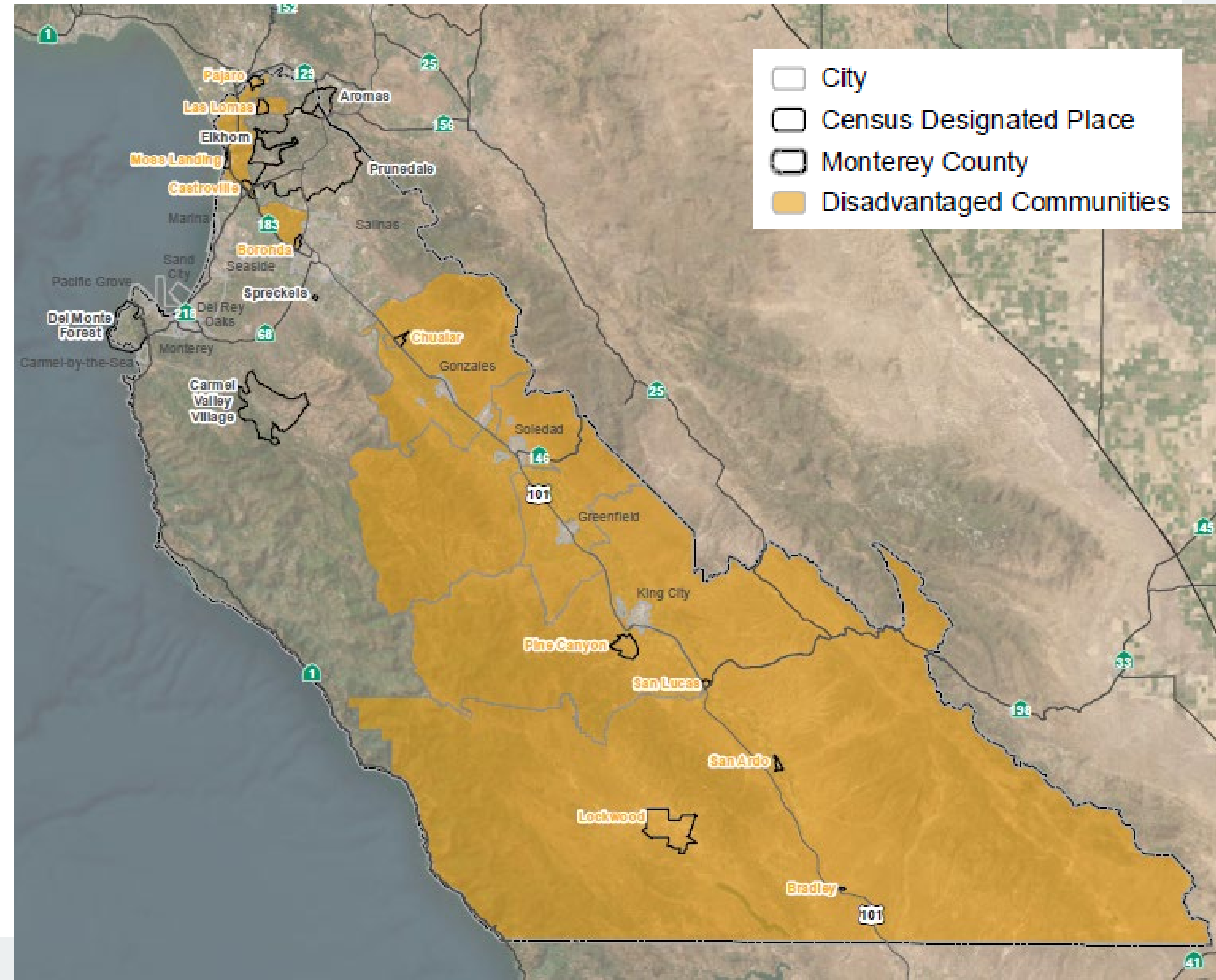
Environmental Justice is defined in California Law as the fair treatment of people of all races, cultures, and incomes with respect to the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of environmental laws, regulations, and policies.

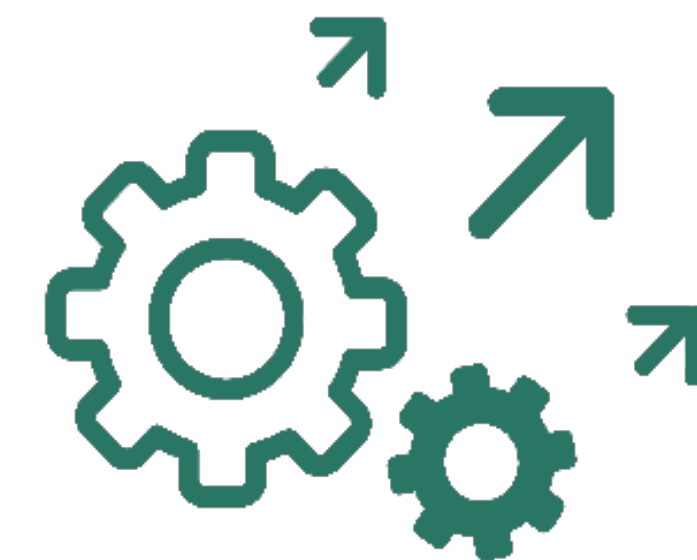

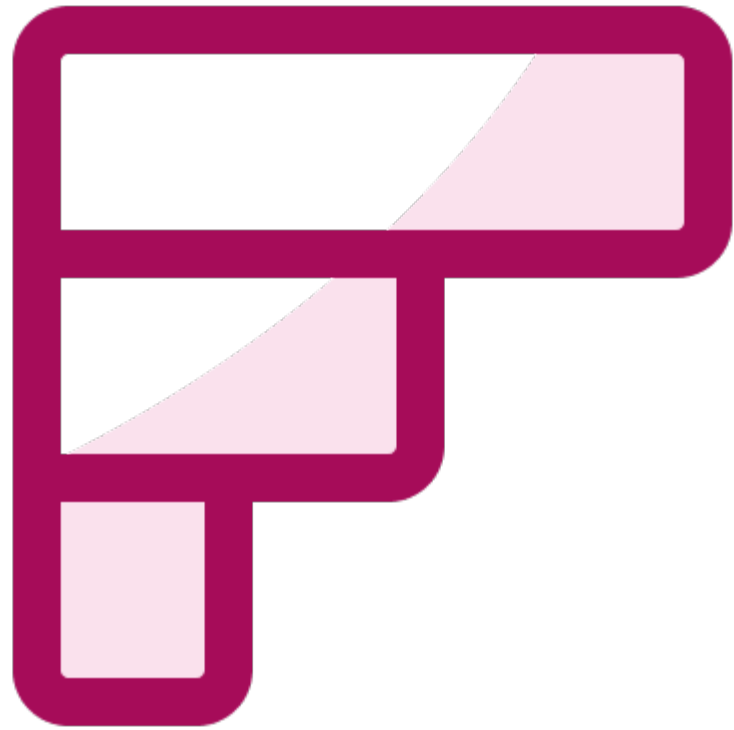
