Narrative: On Friday, March 1st at 2 PM, our office was notified by All Evironmental Inc. that they were on their way to Soledad to do a cleanup at Las Coches Drive due to a semi-truck fire that released diesel and various motor fluids. I arrived on-site and talked to the Soledad Police Officer that was on scene, they stated it was arson that started the fire to the truck. The truck was completely burned down and was already taken away by the time I arrived on-site. The contractor, All Environmental, was also on-site conducting the cleanup. I assessed the situation and determined that the water used to extingush the fire still made it to the storm drain even though it was diked. The City of Soledad Public Works was onsite to assist with the cleanup to the impacted storm drain. I was told by Public Works that the storm drain leads to a holding area right next to their water treatment facility that was about a mile and a half away from the incident. Public Works used a vacuum truck to recover the water that went in to the impacted storm drain. A 55-gallon drum of liquid, debris and oily dirt was recovered from the storm drain and was taken by the contractor for proper disposal along with several other drums of absorbent from the cleanup. A couple of booms were left inside the impacted storm drains to absorb any residual oil during the upcoming rains and are to be removed after the storm. I cleared the scene after the cleanup around 6:30 pm.
