

JJCC Subcommittee Overview

In 2020, SB 823 - Juvenile Justice Realignment added Section(s) 1990 and 1995 to the Welfare and Institutions Code, establishing the Juvenile Justice Realignment Block Grant (JJRBG), as a funding stream for county-based custody, care, and supervision of youth realigned from the state’s Division of Juvenile Justice (DJJ) or who would have otherwise been eligible for DJJ commitment prior to the legislative changes.

Funding eligibility is based on creating a Subcommittee of the existing Juvenile Justice Coordinating Council (JJCC) *“to develop a plan describing the facilities, programs, placements, services, supervision and reentry strategies that are needed to provide appropriate rehabilitation and supervision services for the [realigned] population.”*

In Monterey County, this subcommittee is referred to as the JJCC SB 823 Subcommittee.

The SB 823 JJCC Subcommittee membership is established by Welfare and Institutions Code 1995. The Subcommittee is chaired by the Chief Probation Officer and is composed of a minimum of 10 voting members, currently established at 12 pursuant to bylaws of the Monterey County JJCC.
