Career Exploration and Job Search Assistance

The Workforce Board offers guidance to individuals exploring potential careers, providing information on in-demand jobs, labor market, skills training, and educational pathways. We also offer job search support, including resumé building, interview coaching, and access to a robust job board featuring local employment opportunities – all at no cost to the job seeker!



Skills Training in High-Growth Industry Sectors

Monterey County is home to several high-growth industry sectors experiencing rapid expansion. These industries offer promising career opportunities with excellent earning potential. The Workforce Board is dedicated to helping job seekers capitalize on this growth. We identify local high-growth industries, provide indepth information on in-demand occupations and required skills, and offer specialized training programs to help clients secure employment.





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Human Resources Support

The Workforce Board partners with businesses to create high-performing workforces. By prescreening candidates, crafting effective job descriptions, and leveraging a robust talent network, the Board supports businesses by streamlining the hiring process. Additionally, the Board offers labor market insights and, through a partnership with the California Employers Association, provides access to an HR hotline for expert guidance.



Talent Recruitment

The Workforce Board plays a crucial role in connecting businesses with potential employees through recruitment events such as job fairs and customized recruitment events. By organizing and hosting these events, we create platforms where employers can showcase their companies, vacancies, and company culture to a large pool of job seekers. These events facilitate the hiring process by allowing businesses to conduct initial interviews, collect resumes, and establish a talent pipeline.



Worker Skills Development

The Workforce Board partners with businesses to develop a skilled workforce through on-the-job training (OJT) and incumbent worker training. These programs offer financial incentives to employers who hire and train new employees or upskill their current staff. By providing funding and resources, we help businesses adapt to industry changes, enhance competitiveness, and retain valuable employees.
