About Recurso de Fuerza (RdF)

Recurso de Fuerza is part of a larger strategy to address homelessness in the Pajaro Valley.

What to Expect

- 24-hour staff and security
- Good Neighbor Policy includes neighborhood meetings and communications
- The site will have a perimeter wall, for safety, security, privacy, and aesthetics
- Complete amenities showers, laundry, meals, mail, and beds
- Each unit is for one individual, with a secure locking door
- Wraparound services case management for medical, physical, and employment needs along with housing navigation
- Low barriers to entry
- Enclosed pet area

Not Permitted

- X Loitering outside of the village
- Disrespect to neighbors or neighborhood
- X Unapproved guests
- Drop-in services (restrooms/showers, laundry, or mail) for non-program guests
- X Violence or weapons
- X Drugs or drug use on site



Pajaro River Levee & Encampment

- The Pajaro River levee requires repairs to enhance flood safety and climate resiliency.
- Levee has become an encampment space for unhoused residents in Santa Cruz and Monterey Counties.
- The Partner Counties entered into an agreement to collaborate on addressing the needs of levee occupants.



Funding

 In partnership with the County of Santa Cruz, the Pajaro Regional Flood Management Agency and Westview Presbyterian Church, the County of Monterey was awarded \$8 million to address the encampment in advance of the levee expansion and strengthening project.



Low-Barrier Navigation Centers

- Low-Barrier Navigation Centers are service enriched shelters designed to permanently resolve homelessness. They differ from drop-in centers, transitional housing programs, or traditional emergency shelters.
- In April 2024, the Santa Cruz County Board of Supervisors approved the Three-Year Strategic Framework, which includes developing three Low-Barrier Navigation Centers. Recurso de Fuerza (RdF) aligns with this Framework.
- RdF will be constructed on property owned by Westview Presbyterian Church, which is appropriately zoned for a Low-Barrier Navigation Center.
- Modular units for RdF are provided by the County of Monterey but will transfer to the County of Santa Cruz in 2026.



Partners

The partners involved in RdF are the County of Monterey, County of Santa Cruz, Westview Presbyterian Church, Dignity Moves, and Community Action Board of Santa Cruz County, Inc.
