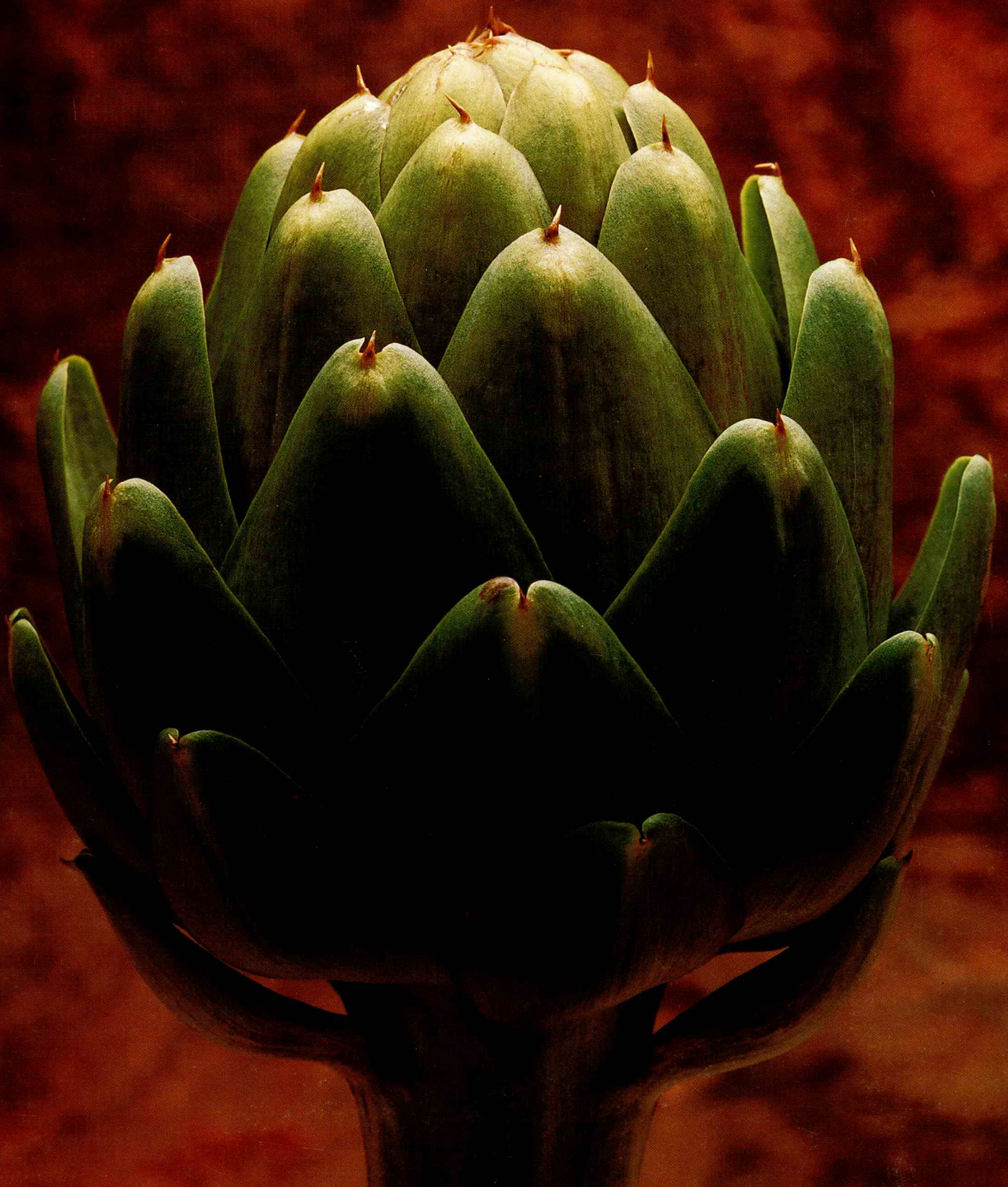

Monterey County gross agricultural revenue decreased for only the second time since 1985. The total value for 1996 is \$1,934,907,558, a \$93,584,652 (4.6%) reduction from 1995. Vegetable crops, which benefited from the 1995 floods, recorded a 9.2% loss and, as a result, were responsible for the major portion of the decrease.

1. Although there was a major increase in production, head lettuce values dropped by nearly 26%.
2. Broccoli continues as the second leading crop, despite increased export and lower prices.
3. Strawberry production and demand were impacted by adverse publicity.
4. Products reporting increases are celery, chili peppers, green onions, tomatoes, brussels sprouts, asparagus, and cilantro.
5. Salad products and food service items continue in demand.
6. Leaf lettuce, carrots, bok choy, cabbage, among others, reported lower prices than 1995.
7. Wine grape growers noted increased acreage and an above average price per ton -- the highest total value in the County's history. Several premium varieties reported average prices higher than some northern regions.
8. Livestock producers continue to report lower prices and reduced inventory.
9. Greenhouse producers of cut flowers are still feeling the effects of imports.
10. Organic growers have expanded their market and increased their volume so that they now represent 1% of the total agriculture value.
11. Exports to Canada, Hong Kong, Taiwan, China, Russia and Vietnam increased, while those to Japan, Mexico, United Arab Emirate and the Philippines were less than in 1995.

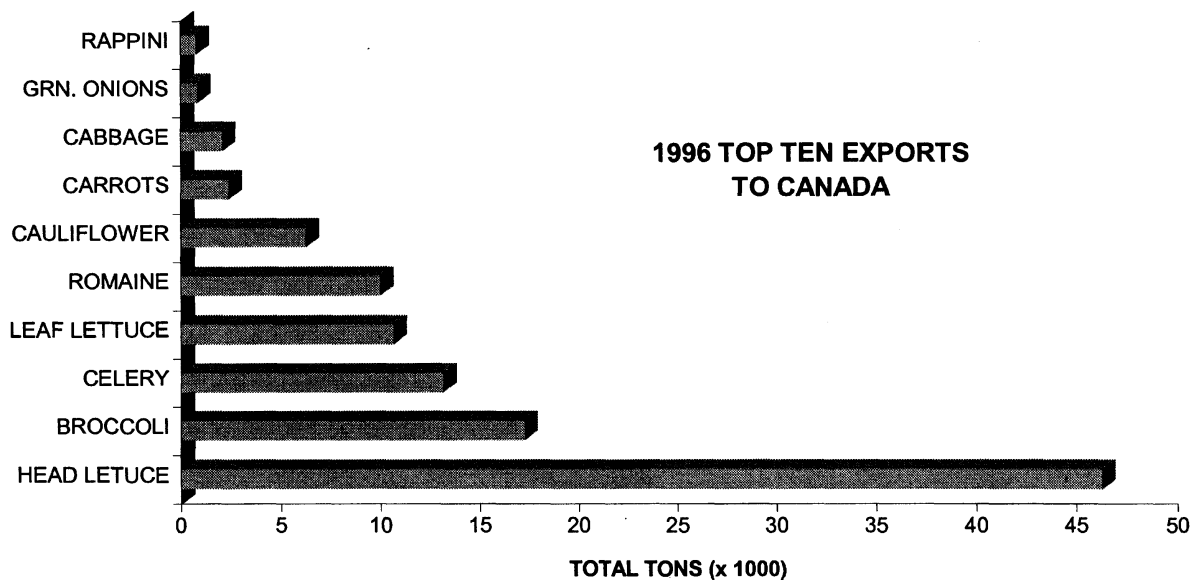

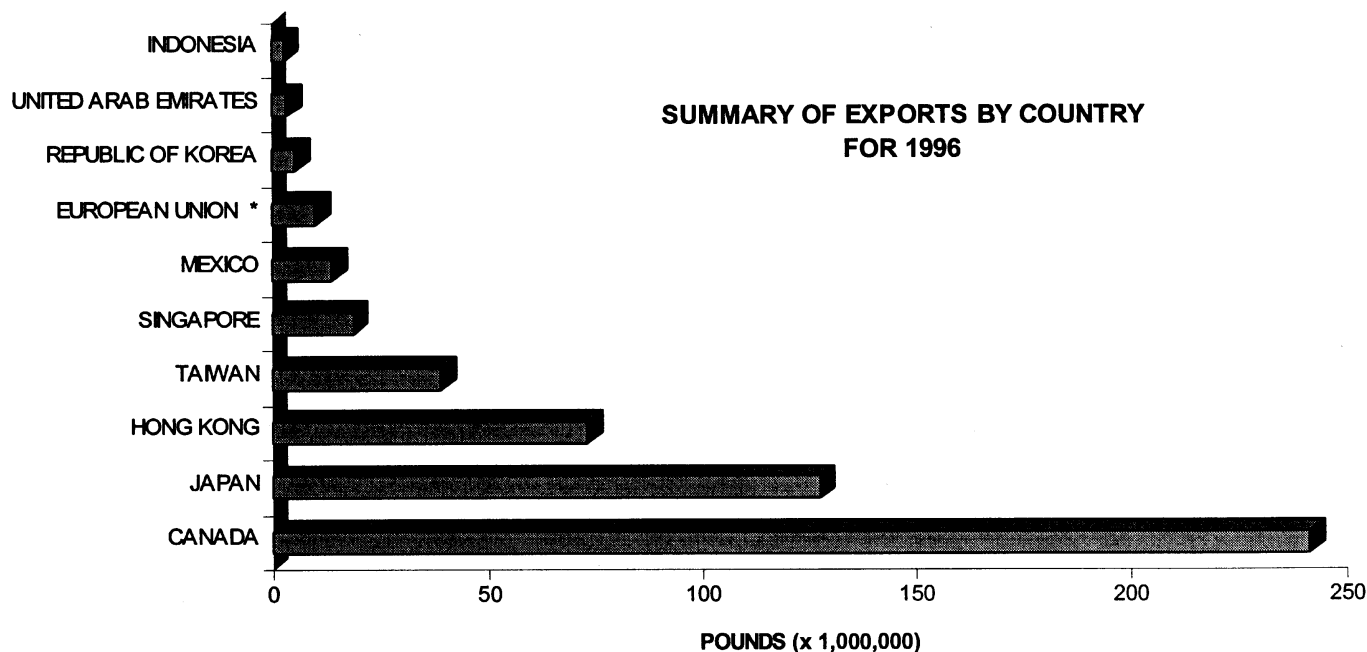

PEST DETECTION

Pest detection is the systematic search for pests outside of a known infested area, or for pests not known to occur in California. The general goal is to detect the insects before they become established over an area so large that eradication is no longer biologically or economically feasible. Detection trapping is performed primarily by the County Agricultural Commissioner's offices.

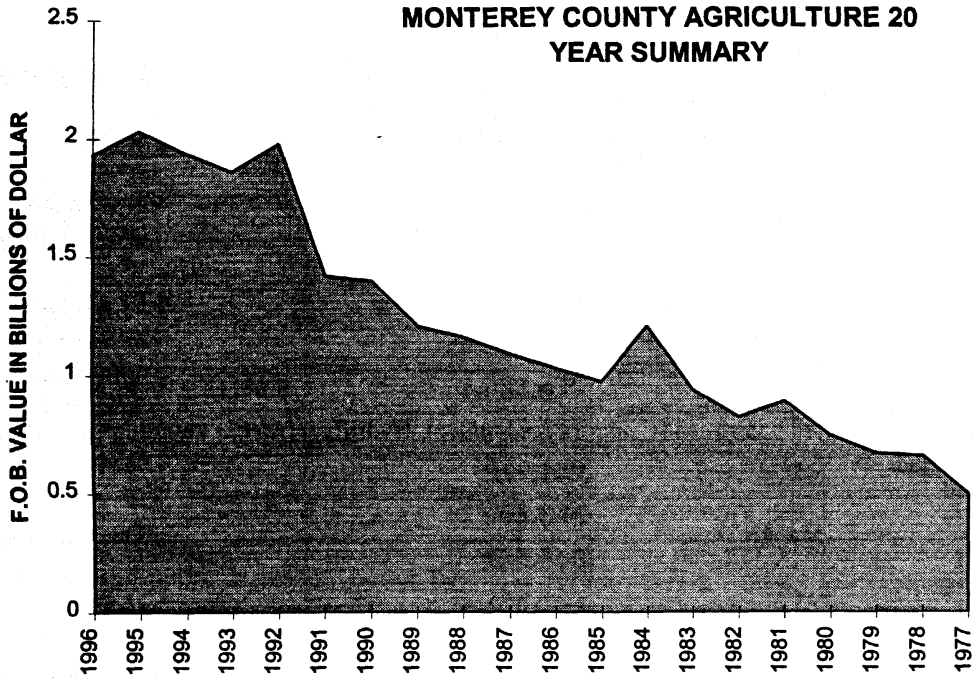
Pest exclusion terminal inspections and pest detection trapping activities accounted for 1,894 hours and 2,974 hours respectively. 58,322 incoming units were inspected, with 28 rejections being written. A total of 10,645 servicings of 981 traps were made. 114 hours were applied to inspecting 183 commercial crop sites of 50 net acres/2,886 gross acres. 15 calls to residences were made for investigation of suspect reports and 125 hours were utilized on inspection/identification of public-reported pests. 32 high hazard locations were inspected and 553 miles of entryways surveyed, accounting for 61.5 and 90.5 hours respectively.

ORGANIC PRODUCTION

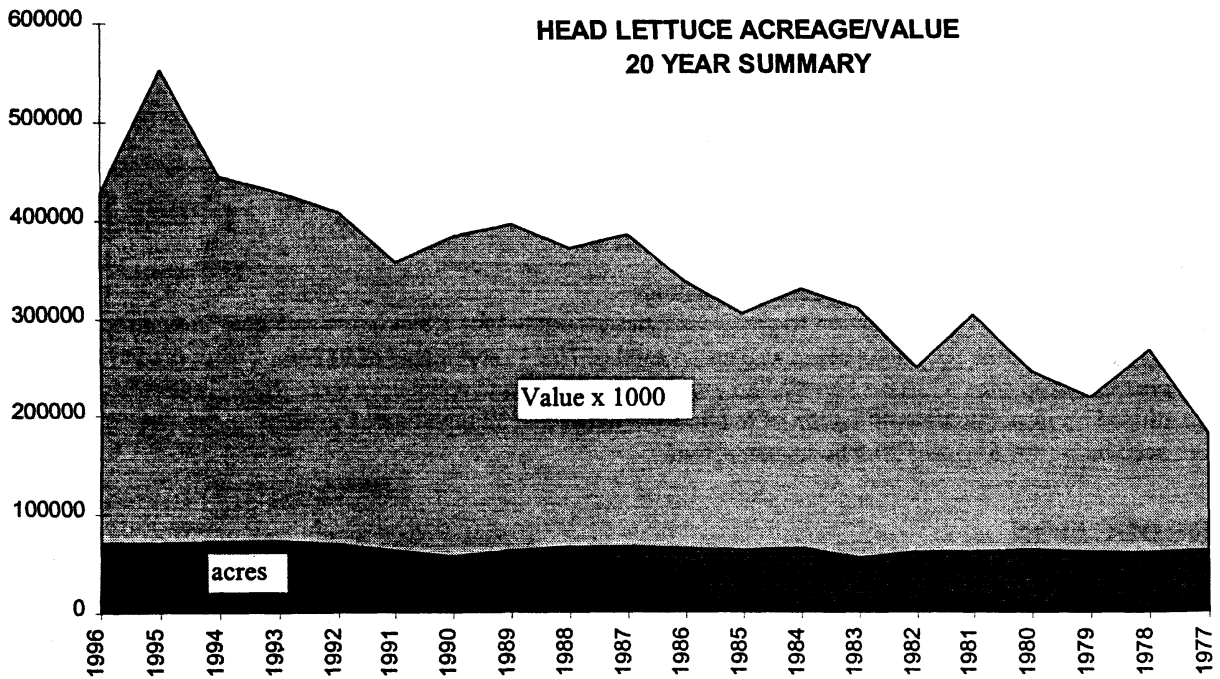
Organic production in Monterey County continues to expand. By state law as of January 1996 land utilized for the production of organic commodities must exhibit freedom from the use of prohibited materials for three years prior to harvest. The range of organic commodities produced is in excess of 50 separate commodities. There are 43 registered producers in Monterey County, who declare a gross value of \$20,722,000 on 1,653 acres of land.
