Monterey County Agriculture increased by 17.16% to establish another all time high of 2.24 billion dollars. Vegetable crops recovered from a year of depressed market prices by 14.5% to a record gross value of more than 2 billion dollars.

- Head lettuce had an 18.8% increase because of increased unit prices.
- Demand for leaf lettuce moved this product into the number 3 slot replacing strawberries.
- Strawberries increased 16% in value due to market demand.
- Wine grapes per ton value increased more than 50% to establish another county record. Non-bearing acreage accounts for 7,800 of the 36,000 acres.
- Broccoli, cauliflower, artichokes, asparagus and carrots were among others reporting decreased values.
- On the plus side were head & leaf lettuce, celery, spinach, tomatoes, green onions, rappini, parsley, garlic, radicchio and bok choy.
- Additions to the million dollar crops this year; avocados, spring mix, rappini, lemons, chard and peas.
- Livestock producers received welcome price increases after several years on the down side.
- Greenhouse cut flower producers continued their downward cycle as inexpensive foreign imports take over. A large majority of the nurseries have converted to field grown flowers increasing the total nursery value by 18%.
- Production of organic products, account for 1% of the counties total value.
- Exports increased by 20%, with Canada, Japan and Hong Kong leading the way. Shipment increases to Mexico, United Arab Emirates, Kuwait, French Polynesia and Vietnam was noted.

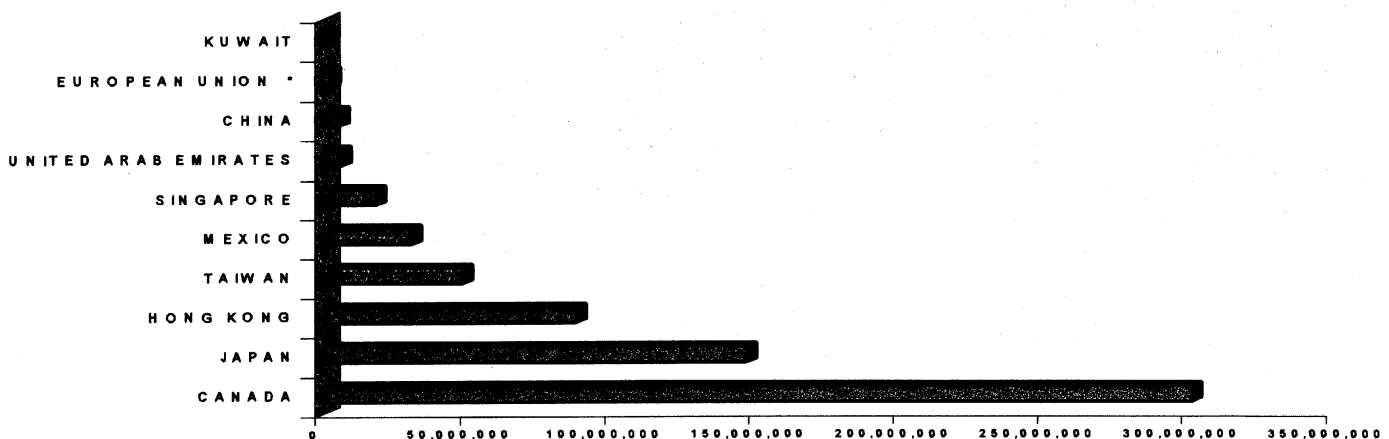

PEST EXCLUSION

Pest exclusion terminal inspections involved 2,270 hours, during which 33,566 incoming shipments were inspected. Ninety six shipments were rejected in violation of quarantine regulations.

PEST DETECTION

Pest detection is the systematic search for pests outside of a known infested area, or for pests not known to occur in California. The general goal is to detect the insects before they become established over an area so large that eradication is no longer biologically or economically feasible. Detection trapping is performed primarily by the County Agricultural Commissioner's offices.

Pest detection trapping activities accounted for 3,685 hours, with a total of 7,811 servicings of 925 traps being made. 119 hours were applied to inspecting 192 commercial crop sites of 50 net acres /2,507 gross acres. 53 calls to residences were made for investigation of suspect reports and 121 hours were utilized on inspection/identification of public-reported pests. 31 high hazard locations were inspected and 679 miles of entryways surveyed, accounting for 100.5 and 92 hours respectively.

ORGANIC PRODUCTION

Organic production in Monterey County continues to expand. By state law, as of January 1996 land used for the production of organic commodities must exhibit freedom from the use of prohibited materials for three years prior to harvest. The range of organic commodities produced is in excess of 50 separate commodities. There are 48 registered producers in Monterey County, who declare a gross value of \$23,609,384 on 3,076.55 acres of land.
