PROCEDURES FOR THE REMOVAL OF HYDRAULIC LIFTS AND THEIR RESERVOIRS

- 1. The Monterey County Health Department (MCHD), Environmental Health Bureau (EHB) does not issue or require permits for the removal of hydraulic lifts or their oil reservoirs.
- 2. Hydraulic oil reservoirs are exempt as Underground Storage Tanks as noted in Title 23 California Code of Regulations and Senate Bill 1191, (Chapter 639 of 1995).
- 3. The removal of hydraulic lifts and reservoirs without a permit from the MCHD does not violate any State of California or MCHD laws, ordinances, or regulations.
- 4. The MCHD does require the removal, and/or remediation of contaminated soils that significantly exceed the MCHD Action Levels as a result of leaking reservoirs or damaged hydraulic lifts.

Request for closure for contaminated or non-contaminated sites from consultants, prospective buyers, or sellers, will require the following:

- A work plan (and fee) detailing all proposed sampling and/or soil borings. Soil sampling shall be conducted in the presence of an inspector of the EHB.
- Completion of an application for soil borings.
- Soil samples are to be taken two feet below the bottom of each former hydraulic lift and/or reservoir location.
- Analysis of the soil shall document that contamination is below the MCHD action levels of 100 parts per million of Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons (TPH). Site-specific information may be used by the MCHD to allow contamination above action levels to remain in place.
