2. Public Comments:

Bob Martin, Rio Farms, asked for clarification about the 400 cfs maximum releases from the Low Level Outlet Works at Nacimiento.

Director Ortiz expressed concern about the impact on the water supply from the pipeline project currently underway in San Ardo.

3. Approve the Minutes of the Reservoir Operations Committee Meeting held on April 7, 2016

4. Review the status of both reservoirs and current releases

Jason Demers, Hydrologist, reported on this item. Since the seasonal low of January 2016, the net increase for San Antonio is 14,500 acre-feet of storage and 68,700 for Nacimiento.

There is a flow of 57 cfs in the Salinas River near the Bradley gage. End of flow in the Salinas River is at river mile 73.5 about five miles from King City.

Nacimiento Reservoir elevation is 742.95 feet and 128,398 acre-feet of storage, 34% of capacity, and current release is 60 cfs.

San Antonio Reservoir elevation is 668.00 feet and 24,750 acre-feet of storage, 7% of capacity, and current release is 3 cfs.

5. Consider recommending that the Monterey County Water Resources Agency Board of Directors adopt a release schedule for Nacimiento and San Antonio reservoirs for 2016 Germán Criollo, Associate Hydrologist, reported on this item.

SUMMARY:

The Board of Directors receives monthly updates on the status of Agency reservoirs.

DISCUSSION/ANALYSIS:

RESERVOIR ELEVATION / STORAGE: As of May 23, 2016, San Antonio Reservoir is at an elevation of approximately 667.9 feet mean sea level (msl), 24,670 acre-feet of storage. Nacimiento Reservoir is at elevation 742.0 feet msl, 125,500 acre-feet of storage. San Antonio Reservoir is currently at 7% of storage capacity and Nacimiento Reservoir is at 33% of capacity.

From the Seasonal low in early January to the peak storage of 24,750 acre-feet of storage on May 19th, San Antonio Reservoir received a net increase of approximately 14,500 acre-feet. Nacimiento Reservoir reached its seasonal peak storage volume of 130,685 acre-feet on April 14th, a net increase of approximately 68,700 acre-feet from the low in early January. Storage volume in both reservoirs is currently in decline.

RESERVOIR RELEASES: Minimum fisheries releases continue from both reservoirs.

Releases as of May 23, 2016:

San Antonio Reservoir: 3 cfs
Nacimiento Reservoir: 60 cfs

Total releases from both reservoirs to the Salinas River are approximately 63 cfs. The following "provisional" flows have been recorded by the USGS:




