Review of Work to Date

- April 30th Workshop Comments
 - Should apply to all noise
 - Noise should be measured at offending property
 - 55 dBA standard should be raised/lowered
 - Should address daytime noise
 - Need better comparison of noise sources
- May 14th Workshop Comments
 - Should consult with noise expert (Brown-Buntin)
 - Should confirm enforceability with Sheriff's Office (Sgt. Joe Moses)
 - Provide information on interior versus exterior noise



Summary of Provisions

- Applies to nighttime noise (10 pm to 7:00 am)
- Applies to all sources of exterior noise (w/ exceptions)
- Noise measured at offending property
- Standard for maximum noise levels is 65 dBA
- Standard for hourly equivalent (L_{eq}) is 45 dBA
- Existing provisions left unchanged (85 dBA)



Exempted uses

• Exempt:


- Bells, chimes, etc as part of religious service, public holiday
- Permitted special events on commercial or institutional premises
- Permitted commercial establishments
- Emergency work
- Commercial agricultural operations
