Seven Common Monterey County Violations from 2015

1. Pesticide labeling, permit conditions, buffers



- Before conducting the pesticide application, read & understand the label and permit conditions
- Be aware of any hazards

2. Pesticide Safety Information Series A-9



- Include emergency medical care info and location of pesticide records
- Be descriptive as possible when explaining locations of documents

3. Written Respiratory Protection Program



Written program includes:

- Medical evaluations
- Procedures for selecting respirators
- Fit testing procedures
- Procedures for proper use

4. Pesticide storage area posting



- Signs visible at 25' from all directions of approach
- Signs in English and Spanish must say the following:
 DANGER POISON STORAGE AREA ALL UNAUTHORIZED PERSONS KEEP OUT KEEP DOORS LOCKED WHEN NOT IN USE

5. Emergency Medical Care



Posting Emergency Medical Care

- Include medical care facility, address, and phone number
- Posted at work site or in work vehicle

Suspected or Actual Pesticide Exposure/Symptoms

- Symptoms that you think are, or MAY be pesticide related require you to IMMEDIATELY take them to medical care
- If employee is sick, employee cannot drive themselves

6. PPE regulations



Required by pesticide product labeling, regulations, or restricted material permit conditions

7. Pesticide storage



LOCKED STORAGE

- All containers (including empties) must be in locked enclosure
- Property operator is responsible
