Reservoir Release Update

RECOMMENDATION:

None – item presented for informational purposes.

SUMMARY/DISCUSSION:

The Reservoir Operations Advisory Committee receives monthly updates on the status of Agency reservoirs.

RESERVOIR ELEVATION / STORAGE: As of August 23 2019, San Antonio Reservoir has a water surface elevation of approximately 727.6 feet (NGVD 29), 123,600 acre-feet of storage. Nacimiento Reservoir has a water surface elevation of approximately 766.4 feet, 212,290 acrefeet of storage. San Antonio Reservoir is currently at 37% of storage capacity and Nacimiento Reservoir is at 56% of capacity.

RESERVOIR RELEASES: The Salinas River Diversion Facility (SRDF) began operating on April 1, 2019. Releases of 375 cfs from Nacimiento Reservoir and 300 cfs from San Antonio Reservoir are being made for groundwater recharge, SRDF operation, and fisheries requirements in accordance with the Salinas Valley Water Project Biological Opinion.

The Salinas River Lagoon is currently closed to the ocean. It opened to the ocean on January 19th and closed during the last weekend in June.

Minor fluctuations in release rates are not presented in this report but are documented in the Salinas Valley Water Project Annual Flow Reports.

Releases as of August 23, 2019:

• Nacimiento Reservoir: 375 cfs

San Antonio Reservoir: 300 cfs

Total releases from both reservoirs to the Salinas River are approximately 675 cfs. The following "provisional" flows have been recorded by the USGS:

• Salinas River near Bradley: 682 cfs (steady) • Salinas River at Soledad: 310 cfs (steady) • Salinas River near Chualar: 152 cfs (steady)

Salinas River near Spreckels: 48 cfs (steady)




