3 Only designated staff of the Behavioral Health Division (BHD) can authorize Short-Doyle funding to acute 24-

4 hour psychiatric in-patient care facilities when Monterey County residents are transferred for in-patient

evaluation and treatment. This may occur when the Natividad Medical Center Mental Health Unit is unable to
 admit a patient, i.e., the unit is at capacity, or when a child under the age of 18 requires admission.

Only designated staff of the Behavioral Health Division can authorize funding of transportation when such
 clients are transported. The following ambulance company by order may be utilized using the Medi-Car:
