Policy

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- 2 Monterey County Behavioral Health (MCBH) shall abide regulations set forth in this and all policies
- 3 related to the delivery of specialty mental health services and substance use disorder services
- 4 under contract with the Department of Health Care Services (DHCS). DHCS and MCBH have
- 5 established a contract for service delivery of specialty mental health services (SMHS) and
- 6 substance use disorder (SUD) services. MCBH and its subcontractors shall abide by the
- agreements set forth for the delivery of SMHS and SUD.

MCBH has adopted and will continue to use evidence-based practice guidelines that meet the following guidelines for specialty mental health and substance use disorders services:

- 1. They are based on valid and reliable clinical evidence or a consensus of health care professionals in the applicable field;
- 2. They consider the needs of the beneficiaries;
- 3. They are adopted in consultation with contracting health care professionals; and
- 4. They are reviewed and updated periodically as appropriate

Evidence Based practice guidelines represent critical factors to be considered with the delivery of specialty mental health and substance use disorder services. An in-depth knowledge of the clinical skills essential for the provision of quality services to individuals should result from ongoing clinical training and regular review of relevant professional literature and education. Practice guidelines do not substitute for dialogue between the clinician and client. Additionally, respect for the client receiving services should be at the core of sound clinical practice.

Practice guidelines are not absolute, but practice that is outside of such parameters requires special consideration, justification, and documents. Practice guidelines may change as new information and/or technology becomes available. Ongoing efforts must be given in respect to the unique values, cultural and spiritual beliefs, life style and personal experience in the provision of SMHS and SUD services to beneficiaries.

Procedure

1. MCBH and its Contractors shall disseminate the guidelines to all affected providers and, upon request, to beneficiaries and potential beneficiaries.

 MCBH and its Contractors shall take steps to assure that decisions for utilization management, beneficiary education, coverage of services, and any other areas to which the guidelines apply shall be consistent with these guidelines.

 MCBH Quality Improvement, MCBH Training Department, and Contracted Provider Representatives shall identify and adopt the use of evidence-based practices (EBP).
 For Drug Medi-Cal Organized Delivery System (DMC-ODS) Waiver, at least two (2) EBP

 per modality shall be adopted.5. Utilization Management staff shall use the EBP guidelines in making decisions, as applicable, about authorization of services.
