1 Policy

The Monterey County Behavioral Health ED Crisis Team is located with Natividad Medical Center (NMC). The ED Crisis Intervention Specialist shall adhere to all policy and procedures regarding involuntary detention for assessment, evaluation, and treatment of persons with mental health disorders who are a danger to themselves, danger to others, and/or gravely disabled. The Crisis Intervention Specialist shall comply with Division 5 of the California Welfare and Institutions Code (CA W&I), which contains the Lanterman-Petris-Short (LPS) Act and the Children's Civil Commitment and Mental Health Treatment Act of 1988.

The Monterey County Behavioral Health ED Crisis Team shall make appropriate entries in the electronic health record, Avatar. This may also include, entries within NMC's electronic health record. Contact with individuals by a Crisis Intervention Specialist may be face-to-face or by telephone and shall be documented in Avatar and NMC EHR, as appropriate.

- 16 Procedure
 - 1. Each contact with an individual shall be documented in the individual's electronic health record by the Crisis Intervention Specialist.
 - 2. The Crisis Intervention Specialist shall conduct an assessment for determination of needs, assessment of risk, and may include an evaluation for determination of involuntary detention.
- The Crisis Intervention Specialist shall complete all necessary documentation in Avatar, including, but not limited to Admission, CSI Admission, Assessment, Mental Status
 Examination, Diagnosis (DSM 5 and ICD-10 code set), Client Relationships, Financial

Eligibility, and Discharge Episode. The Crisis Intervention Specialist shall comply with any additionally programmatic requirements and completion of additional documents.
The Crisis Intervention Specialist shall document service delivery via progress note in accordance with clinical documentation standards.
