Central Coast Regional Water Quality Control Board (Central Coast Water Board) staff invites you to a meeting to discuss the development of organophosphate pesticides (chlorpyrifos, diazinon, and malathion) total maximum daily loads (TMDLs) for streams within the lower Salinas River watershed. A TMDL is a requirement of the federal Clean Water Act and applies to waterbodies that fail to meet water quality standards.

Purpose of Meeting

Public outreach is a part of the TMDL development process. This workshop will provide participants with: (1) background on the Central Coast Water Board's mandates under the federal Clean Water Act and the state Porter-Cologne Water Quality Control Act; (2) background on organophosphate pesticide water quality impairments; and, (3) an opportunity for you to provide input on the scope and nature of the water quality problem and on the scope of the proposed TMDLs.
