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Narrative: After arriving on the scene I was directed to Kevin Anderson, who had a team already cleaning up. The cleaning crew suctioned the waste from the two entry points and the contaminants that spilled in the gutter. I was told that the release originated from a "man hole" in Pacific Street near Doud Street as well as a clean-out in a medical office parking lot. The sewage entered the storm drain gutter on Pacific Street and a natural storm drainage channel adjacent to the office parking lot. City of Monterey ammonia screening indicated that sewage hadn't reached the ocean. City of Monterey Public Works flushed the gutter on Pacific Street with water and recovered the rinse water with a vacuum truck.
