• Monitoring for the Asian Citrus Psyllid continues in the Soledad area; numbers have gone down, but it is still an active infestation;

- We received an information request from the Sacramento Bee regarding pesticide investigations, reports, and District Attorney referrals. Other California Agricultural Commissioners have received the same request;
- <u>AB 1919</u> proposes to give the California Department of Pesticide Regulation authority to levy civil penalties up to \$25,000 for each violation occurring on or after January 1, 2021.

Project Description: Administrative Permit to allow: 1) Demolition of two mobile homes and six greenhouses (101,000 square feet total) and construction of two new greenhouses (97,554 square feet total) and two new warehouses (8,800 square feet each); and 2) Use of the existing proposed greenhouses for up to 140,800 square feet of canopy for commercial cannabis cultivation and nursery and use of the existing and proposed warehouses for commercial cannabis processing, non-volatile manufacturing and self-distribution.
