2. Education and information (20 minutes):

- a. Linda McGlone, Monterey County Health Department
 - i. The Health Department was awarded funding directly from the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to address teen dating violence in Salinas, specifically 93905. Linda has partnered with the Community Alliance for Safety and Peace (CASP) and the Monterey County Rape Crisis Center (MCRCC) to implement some of the proposed strategies outlines in the grant. Some of these strategies include:
 1. Increasing public awareness about teen dating violence
 2. Primary prevention strategies (i.e. Safe Dates that the Health Department is facilitating at all four Salinas High Schools)
 3. Crime Prevention Through Design (CPTED) to inform improvements to the physical environment

4. Integrating Teen Dating Violence into overall violence reduction plans and strategies
- ii. There will be a training on Safe Dates on January 30th, 2017
- iii. Linda asked the DVCC members present if they have any other programs that she might look to include or inquire about. Programs included:
 1. Sticks and Stones

 - ii. The YWCA is partnering with other Monarch Services and Community Solutions.
 - iii. The YWCA will not house human trafficking victims with domestic violence survivors. Triqui-speaking survivors will be housed with domestic violence survivors.
