- a. Carmen Gil, Monterey County Health Department
 - i. Carmen currently serves as the Hub Collaborative Director for the Building Healthy Communities initiative, a 10-year commitment by The California Endowment that aims to improve the health and wellbeing of the community
 - ii. Carmen presented information about domestic violence as a public health issue. The slides of her presentation are attached to this document.
 - iii. The DVCC discussed unemployment as a risk factor for domestic violence. Shree Goldman stated "the best way to stop a bullet is a job," which she heard from an organization based in Los Angeles called Homeboy Industries. Linda McGlone cited the Alisal Vibrancy plan as a program created to address the unemployment in the Alisal neighborhood.
 - iv. Carmen stated that domestic violence is the third leading cause of homelessness nationally.
 - v. The DVCC discussed the importance of education and teaching children from a young age how to be respectful and kind humans. The Health Department, YWCA, and Monterey County Rape Crisis Center (MCRCC) each have programs designed to prevent domestic and sexual violence.
