

Highest proportion of undocumented residents of county population of any California County






## Industry Sector

#### COVID-19 Among Monterey County Residents: Industry Sector




## Exposure Risk

## Housing Circumstances




- 56% renting households spend >30% income on rent and utilities


#### FY 2018-19 Call Volume: 9,695

- California's Monterey County agricultural workers were three times more likely to become infected by the virus
- 54% reported costs, no insurance, and/or lack of sick leave as significant barriers to accessing healthcare
- 46% reported decreased farm work time and subsequent income losses
- 43% reported worksites did not provide face-coverings at all
- 90% reported that COVID-19 had prompted them to change the ways they protect their families when they arrive home from work (e.g. washing hands, changing clothes, showering).
